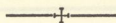

## AUDITORS' CERTIFICATE.



We have audited and vouched the foregoing Accounts, and certify them to be correct.

The Receipts for the year show a decrease of £2,628 1s. 2d. as compared with those of last year. This decrease occurs principally in the Fellowship Fees. As against the fall off in the Receipts, there is a decrease in the Expenses of the year of £315 15s. 10d., as compared with preceding year, 1900-1901.

The Revenue of the College for the past twelve months shows the following result, viz. :—

## College.

### *Painting and Repairing of the College.*

It was mentioned in last year's Report that the roof of the College had been put into proper repair, and new sewers laid down. The cost of these improvements amounted to about £450.

During the present year, the hall, front and back stairs, and the board-room, have been painted and decorated, new granite steps have been laid down at the front door, and the pavement of the hall repaired and made level, new electroliers have been put up in the board-room, hall, and front stairs, and all the pictures and busts cleaned.

### *Annual Dinner.*

At the Annual General Meeting of the College last June, a resolution was passed recommending the Council to have an annual College dinner.

The Council has fixed the 10th May as the date of the dinner for this year.

### *Election of Representative of the College on the General Medical Council.*

At the last meeting in January the Council again elected Mr. C. B. Ball to fill this office for the ensuing year.

### *Royal Army Medical Corps.*

In the summer of last year the Secretary of State for War appointed a Committee to inquire into the organization of the Royal Army Medical Corps.

This Council wrote to the Secretary of State, calling his attention to the widespread dissatisfaction which existed amongst Irish surgeons at their inadequate representation on this Committee, and also calling his attention to the great number of Irish graduates and licentiates in the service.

As far as could be ascertained, there were 892 members of the corps, divided as follows :—

and of these 335, no less than 124 were either Fellows or Licentiates of this College. The Secretary of State appointed Sir W. Thomson a member of the Committee.



*Death of Sir W. MacCormac, Bart., K.C.B., a Fellow of the College.*

The following letter was sent on 5th December to Lady MacCormac :—

## Museum.

### *Report of the Curator.*

GENTLEMEN,—I have the honour to report that the Museum still continues to be largely used by the Examiners and Professors of the College.

The work of cataloguing the specimens in the Pathological Museum is progressing steadily, though slowly. I have completed the rough "slip" catalogue; while, with the aid of the students, for which an allowance has been granted, I have been able to examine microscopical sections of some two hundred specimens. The still, which was purchased during the year, is now working most satisfactorily; so that I hope in the near future to have all the specimens remounted in clear, redistilled spirit, instead of the dirty yellow fluid which most of the bottles at present hold.

Several new specimens were added, and many necessary repairs were effected during the year. The new specimens were presented by Sir George Duffey, Professor Fraser, Dr. Craig, Mr. L. H. Ormsby, Mr. Graves Stoker, Mr. W. Taylor, and Mr. Wellcome (of Burroughs Wellcome & Co.).
