The College.

Irish Universities Bill, 1908.

The Fellows of the College are already aware that before the introduction of the Irish University Bill in Parliament, the President and Council took the most active steps to lay the claims of the College before the Prime Minister and the Chief Secretary for Ireland and other important members of the Government. While the measure was being debated in Parliament, these efforts were continued.

Deputations consisting of the President, Vice-President and Members of Council waited upon the Chief Officers of State, the Right Hon. Gentleman the Leader of the Opposition, and other influential Parliamentary leaders. By these means, and by correspondence, the claims of our College to a share in the University Grant were clearly and emphatically laid before those in authority.

It is much to be regretted that these efforts have been quite futile, and that His Majesty's Government has not seen fit to assist in any way this ancient and honourable College in the efforts it has made for many years to maintain a high standard of Medical Education.

The College now must look forward to a period of intense competition with State-endowed Institutions, supplied at the public expense, with the most costly equipment, with well-salaried officials, and with all the prestige of Governmental Institutions.

Time alone can demonstrate whether our College will be able to hold its own against such competition; but the President and Council are resolved to spare no effort in maintaining in the highest possible degree of efficiency, compatible with the financial position of the College, the only Medical School in Ireland which receives no Governmental assistance, and from which all sectarian influences are rigidly excluded.

British Association's Meeting in Dublin, September, 1908.

The Council placed all the rooms in the College at the disposal of the Association.

The Section of Zoology, to which Professor Fraser acted as Honorary Secretary, held all its meetings in the College. The Council received from the Recorder of the Section the following vote of thanks:—

That the most sincere thanks of the Section be returned to the President and Council of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland for so kindly placing the College at the disposal of the Section.

Research Defence Society.

The Honorary Secretary, Mr. Stephen Paget, wrote to the President asking him to take whatever steps he thought best to establish a Branch Society in Dublin.

The Council requested the President to act conjointly with the President of the Royal College of Physicians in carrying out the proposal. A largely-attended public meeting was held, and a branch was formed.

Representative of the College on the General Medical Council.

On February 4th Sir Thomas Myles was elected to represent the College on the General Medical Council.

Professor Fraser.

Professor Fraser having completed his twenty-fifth year as Professor of Anatomy in the College on November 4th, 1908, the Council, to mark their appreciation of his invaluable services to the College, presented him with a piece of plate and a cheque for 100 guineas.

Vote of Congratulation.

The Council passed a resolution congratulating Surgeon-General George D. Bourke, C.B., on his appointment as Honorary Physician to His Majesty.

Carmichael Prize Essay for 1908.

Two Essays were sent in. The judges did not consider either of sufficient merit to justify them in awarding the Prize.

The money was, in accordance with the terms of Mr. Carmichael's Will, paid to the Medical Benevolent Fund.

Barker Prize for 1908.

This Prize was awarded to Mr. G. C. Sneyd. Miss Clarke was awarded an additional Prize.

Meetings held in the College.

Museum.

Report of the Curator.

GENTLEMEN,—I have, after many attempts, succeeded in distributing the specimens—both Anatomical and Pathological—so that they can be fairly well arranged in the somewhat cramped space at my disposal. Further, it is proposed to number all the presses and shelving, so that the position of specimens may be readily located.

All specimens and organs of Invertebrates have been classified, labelled, and placed in Press 1.

The organs of Fish have been similarly classified and labelled, and placed in Press 2. Skeletons of Fish come next; and these in turn are followed by organs and specimens of Amphibia, Lizards, and Reptiles.

The organs of Birds, Skeletons, and Skulls of Birds have been classified, labelled, and placed on the top shelves, and following these are the Skulls of Mammals.

The Skeletons of the Lemurs, Monkeys, and Apes have also been arranged, labelled, and placed in Presses 9 to 12.

Following these are the classified and labelled Skulls of Anthropological interest.

Next come human Skulls and Skeletons from the Embryo to Edentulous old age; and finally come a series of skulls of murderers, casts of Dean Swift's brain and skull, and a few crania of idiots.

In addition, the skeletons of an Ostrich and of a Bear have been remounted.

During the year the floor of Museum has been painted and varnished. New locks have been put on all the cases. The shelving in more than half of the presses downstairs has been painted. Nearly 300 casts have been numbered and arranged on shelving in the Old Pharmacy Room, and a list given to the School Porter for the use of the Professors.

New specimens were presented by Dr. Boxwell, Dr. James Craig, Mr. L. G. Gunn, Sir John Moore, Dr. Rowlette, Professor Scott, and Mr. W. Taylor.
