

The same year (1893) I was admitted as a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons.

In 1894 I spent six months in Vienna and Berlin, and studied Midwifery and Gynæcology under Professors Schanta, Braun and Gusseron, and Herrn Wertheim, Woertz, Lumpe, Schäfer and Strassmann. On my return I was appointed Gynæcologist to the Richmond, Whitworth, and Hardwicke (Government) Hospitals, which I still hold.

From 1895 to 1898 I was Assistant Master to the Coombe Lying-In Hospital, and I am now Supernumerary Assistant to that Institution.

I have contributed the following papers to the Royal Academy of Medicine :—On the need of women as Poor Law Guardians—A case of Rigid O.s.—Discussion by Dührssen's method—A case of double Ovariectomy, with eighteen months interval between the operations.

In 1896 I obtained the degrees of Doctor of Medicine and Master of Obstetrics at the Royal University

From 1896 to 1897 I acted as Examiner in Midwifery to the Royal College of Surgeons.

Both in the Richmond and Coombe Hospitals I have had considerable experience in teaching, and have also done a large share of Operative work in these Institutions, as well as in my private practice.

If appointed to the post I shall do my best to maintain the reputation of the School of Surgery and of the College, to which I have the honour to belong.
