REPORT

25th April, 1955.—At an extraordinary meeting an agreed joint comment with the Royal College of Physicians on Part D of the Report on the Visitation of Medical Schools in Ireland was passed for forwarding to the Irish Registration Council and to the General Medical Council.

3rd May, 1955—A joint meeting of representatives of the Royal College of Surgeons of England, Edinburgh, Ireland and Australasia together with the Glasgow Royal Faculty was held in connection with the reciprocal arrangements between these bodies for the Primary Fellowship Examination.

12th May, 1955—Examiners in Court A and Court B were elected. The cordial thanks of the Council were sent to the Royal Academy of Medicine for the gift of fourteen microscopes.

9th June, 1955—Committees were appointed.

13th October, 1955—Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney was appointed to be a member of the General Medical Council for a period of one year.

10th November, 1955—It was decided to invite Dr. R. B. Cattell and Professeur Rene Leriche to accept the Honorary Fellowship of the College.

8th December, 1955—A memorandum approved by the Association of Graduates asked for the institution of a degree of "Membership" of the College. The Council did not agree with a qualification based only on the lapse of time.

12th January, 1956—The Council heard with regret of the death of Dr. French O'Carroll and Professeur Leriche.

A proposal was accepted from the Royal College of Physicians to set up a joint committee to consider the teaching in the Final Years.

It was decided to invite Sir Clement Price Thomas to accept the Honorary Fellowship.

It was decided to set up an advisory committee with members from the Council, the Faculties of Medicine and Dentistry and the Association of Graduates. The numbers were finally fixed at 6, 3, 1 and 2, respectively.

Messrs. Fraser, Stoney and Doolin were appointed adjudicators for the Carmichael Prize Essay.

9th February, 1956.—Mr. Riordan was appointed to represent the College at a meeting in connection with the control of the use of Isotopes in Ireland.

8th March, 1956. The Annual General Meeting of the College was held for the purpose of electing members to the Senate Nominating Committee.

THE SPANISH AND ITALIAN MINISTERS donated copies of Spanish and Italian medical periodicals.

An important event of the year was the purchase of Vesalius' *De Fabrica*, the sumptuously produced edition of 1555. It was bought from Col. C. Wilson, Larkfield, Co. Waterford. Subsequent examination of the copy revealed that it was owned in 1859 by Dr. John Herbert Orpen of Lisheens, Co. Cork, who was admitted a licentiate of this College in 1830.

An exhibition was arranged of books relating to the work of Antonj van Leeuwenhoek (1632-1723).

A collection of instruments invented by pioneers of Irish urology was exhibited at the Royal Society of Medicine, London, and at Cambridge University before the University History of Medicine Society. By permission of the Council, these instruments were shown by Mr. Anthony Walsh, F.R.C.S.I., as illustrations to a paper read by him in London and Cambridge on the history of Irish Urology. They included Dease's lithotome, L'Estrange's calculofractor, Crampton's evacuator, and Cruise's endoscope. Both audiences were very much impressed, not only by the important contributions made by these Irishmen, but also by the fact that so many of the original instruments had been so carefully preserved.
