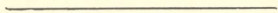

## ANNUAL REPORT.

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On 13th June, 1929, Mr. W. C. P. Smyly was unanimously re-elected as Honorary Librarian.

Dr. W. W. Keen, of Philadelphia, presented to the College a photostat taken from the sarcophagus of William Harvey.

On 1st July the Council decided on the recommendation of the Education Committee—

(1) That the Chairs of Chemistry, Physics, and Physiology be amalgamated.

(2) That the salary of the amalgamated posts be £600 per annum.

(3) That the Professorship of Chemistry, Physics, and Physiology be declared vacant, and that the Professor be given an honorarium of £500.

(4) That as soon as possible the vacant position be advertised.

The winner of the Purefoy Memorial Prize informed the Council of her intention to proceed to America to study under Professor Harvey Cushing.

It is with profound regret that the Council records the death of their friend, colleague, and President, Thomas Eagleson Gordon, on the 24th July, 1929. The death of Mr. Gordon brings to his many friends and pupils scattered far and near a sense of personal loss. The College has lost in its President a good friend, an eminent surgeon, and one whose loss will be mourned by many.

On the 12th September Dr. W. J. E. Jessop was appointed Professor of Chemistry, Physics, and Physiology, to hold such office during the pleasure of the Council.



At a Special Meeting of the Council, held on 17th October, to elect from the past Presidents of the College a President to hold office until June, 1930, the immediate past President, Mr. Andrew Fullerton, was elected.

Resignation of Professor McConnell. — Professor McConnell wrote stating that on and after 31st December he would be unable to discharge the duties of Professor of Surgery. Professor McConnell's resignation was accepted with regret.

Mr. Arthur Chance resigned his position as a Member of Council on 11th December, 1929.

On 11th December, 1929, Mr. Arthur Chance was elected Professor of Surgery.

On 22nd January, 1930, Sir William Taylor was unanimously re-elected to represent the College at the meetings of the General Medical Council.

On 22nd January, 1930, the appointment was confirmed, that Mr. R. C. B. Maunsell should represent the College at the meetings of the Saorstát Medical Council.

The Council granted permission to the Royal Zoological Society, the Royal Veterinary College, the Hibernian Catch Club, the use of the Examination Hall for the holding of meetings.
