ANNUAL REPORT.

May, 1936.—The Finance Committee recommended the purchase of £3,000 G.S.R. 4 per cent. Debentures and £2,000 Dublin Corporation 4 per cent. Debentures.

The Finance Committee recommended that the various Professors, etc., be given a bonus on their year's work of 50 guineas each, and that the Part-time Professors be paid for the new year at an increased rate.

July, 1936.—It was proposed that the President, the Vice-President, and Mr. Chance be empowered to arrange for re-seating in the lecture theatre, to spend approximately £500.

Dr. Earl resigned his position as Assistant to the Professor of Pathology.

October, 1936.—The Registrar reported the death of Mr. W. G. Ridgway, F.R.C.S.I., member of the Council. A resolution of sympathy with the members of his family was passed.

Recommendation from Mr. D. L. Rogers, L.D.S.I., asking the Council to set standard of marks at the Final Dental Examination as follows:—

1st class honours to students obtaining	75 per cent.
2nd " " " "	65 "

November, 1936.—Mr. George Ridgway's offer to present an elk's head to the College was accepted with thanks. Mr. Stokes was asked to arrange for the setting up of same.

The Council appointed Professor Jessop to represent the College in place of Professor Boxwell on the Hospitals' Trust Medical Research Council.

January, 1937.—Sir Thomas Myles, F.R.C.S.I., was appointed to represent the College at the meetings of the General Medical Council.

It was decided to hold the Charter Day Dinner on 6th February, 1937.

February, 1937.—Professor Boxwell recommended Mr. J. J. Carter to be awarded the Barker Prize of £26 5s. for his dissection of the knee joint.

The impounding of the space in the old museum for the new lecture room has certainly served a very useful purpose. It has, however, naturally reduced the remaining available space to narrow limits. Since, besides being a museum of Zoological specimens and anthropological varieties, it is mainly used as a lumber room and furniture store, it is now almost impossible to see them at all, and what are left of the specimens in separate glass cases are in danger of irretrievable ruin. The Curator would again respectfully suggest to the Council that these specimens be made over for safe keeping to the Zoological Museum in Trinity College, where their value will be appreciated and which is the only School in this country where Zoology as a subject is systematically taught. The Professor of Zoology in Dublin University,

Dr. J. Brontë Gatenby, has already inspected some of these specimens and has expressed his willingness to take them over. Under his supervision, the specimens would be classified; they would still be the property of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, and would be available at all times to anybody expressing a desire to study them.
