

July, 1938.—The Council resolved that the Francis Nolans Prize should be awarded to the son or daughter of an Irish Doctor who obtains the highest marks in the Preliminary Examination in September, the amount of the prize to be £30, to be given in remission of lecture fees, and the first award to be made in September, 1939.

October, 1938.—A resolution of sympathy was passed with Lady Woods and her family on the loss which they and the Council had sustained by the death of Sir Robert H. Woods.

Dr. J. D. H. Widdess was appointed to the post of Lecturer in Biology.

It was decided that there should be two Professors in Surgery, having equal status, who should divide the work and emoluments of the present post of Professor of Surgery.

The resignation of Dr. W. R. Fearon of his post as Examiner in Psychology for the Diploma in Psychological Medicine was accepted, and Mr. J. M. Henry, F.T.C.D., was appointed to fill the vacancy.

The resignation of Mr. Alfred Miller, on the grounds of ill-health, from his post of Registrar to the College, was accepted with the unanimous regret of the Council.

Mr. Seton Pringle was appointed to represent the Council in discussions with the Department of the Minister of Defence regarding A.R.P.

Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney was elected to represent the College on the General Medical Council for one year from 14th October, 1938.

November, 1938.—Professor W. J. E. Jessop was elected to represent the College on the Medical Research Council of Ireland for the period 26th January, 1939, to 25th January, 1943.

Mr. R. F. J. Henry was elected additional Professor in Surgery.

Professor W. N. Rae was appointed Registrar of the College.

December, 1938.—It was resolved to hold the Charter Day Dinner on Saturday, 18th February, 1939.

January, 1939.—A resolution of sympathy was passed with Dr. Douglas Hyde, President of Eire, in his recent bereavement.

February, 1939.—Mr. Henry Wade, C.M.G., D.S.O., was unanimously elected an Honorary Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland.

March, 1939.—Mr. Richard W. Nicholls offered a picture of Surgeon Robert Liston, and this gift was accepted, with thanks.

Museum.

GENTLEMEN,

Since my last report, significant changes have taken place in the Museum.

As previously intimated, negotiations were on foot for the disposal of the major portion of the Zoological specimens. Many of these were of intrinsic value, and it was felt that they were deserving of a better fate than the slow disintegration or more violent demolition to which they were being subjected, every time a change in the storage accommodation of the museum was found necessary. Hitherto, these specimens had lived in rickety glass cases, in semi-darkness, and of no interest or use to anybody. Many of them, nevertheless, were very beautiful and valuable preparations, and as Professor Gatenby put it—part of the “intellectual heritage” of the nation. They have now found a permanent home in the School of Zoology in Trinity College.

I would like to take this opportunity of thanking Professor Gatenby for his kindly advice and practical assistance in the matter of this collection. Rather than allow it to be dissipated and sold abroad, the Board of Trinity College offered for it a sum of £50—an offer which I had the President’s authority to accept.

This move created a stir in other departments of the School. The newly established department of Biology found a quantity of material quite valuable for teaching purposes, and Dr. Widdess has removed a considerable number of specimens to new cases in his department.

Those of the skulls that had definite anthropological interest have been transferred to the School of Anatomy, under Professor Evatt, who also has provided special cases for their reception.

The Tasmanian head, and the mummies, have not been disturbed.

From the Pathological collection, the number of specimens borrowed for teaching and examination purposes has been up to the average, and seventeen fresh preparations have been added by the Curator, during the year.
