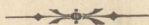

The College.

The War.

The first edition of the "Roll of Honour," containing the names of Fellows and Licentiates who have given or are giving their services to the State, has been published. The Roll is being kept up to date, and now contains over 1,200 names.

On the initiative and under the organization of the President of the College arrangements have been made to staff for one year a Military General Hospital in France with men educated in the Dublin Schools of Medicine. Each unit, consisting of two physicians, three surgeons, one ophthalmic surgeon, one radiographer, one bacteriologist, and one anæsthetist, will serve for a period of three months.

The members of the first unit embarked for France on the 5th May, and, prior to embarkation, were received at Windsor Castle by Their Majesties the King and Queen.

Election of Honorary Librarian.

Mr. R. Bolton M'Causland was re-elected Honorary Librarian.

Election of Secretary of Council.

On June 15th, 1916, Mr. Charles M. Benson was re-elected Secretary of Council.

Resignation of Professor Sir John William Moore, M.D.

On July 6th, 1916, Professor Sir John William Moore, M.D., resigned the Chair of Medicine, which he had occupied since the year 1889. When accepting the resignation, the thanks of the Council were conveyed to Sir John Moore for his long and loyal services. On retirement he was presented with a piece of plate.

Election of Professor of the Theory and Practice of Physic.

On July 20th, 1916, the Council assembled for the purpose of appointing a Professor of the Theory and Practice of Medicine in the room of Professor Sir John William Moore, resigned, when Thomas Gillman Moorhead, M.D., F.R.C.P.I., was elected unanimously.

Barker Anatomical Prize for 1916.

There were no competitors for this prize.

Representative of the College on the General Medical Council.

On February 1st, 1917, Sir Arthur Chance was re-elected to represent the College on the General Medical Council.

Meetings held in the College.

The Council granted the use of the College for meetings of the Royal Academy of Medicine in Ireland, the Irish Medical Association, Royal Medical Benevolent Fund Society, Irish Medical Committee, Dublin Clinical Club, and the Irish Branch British Dental Association.

Charter-Day Dinner.

Owing to the war, it was decided not to hold the usual Charter-Day Dinner.

Votes of Condolence.

On the 2nd November, 1916, a resolution of condolence was passed on the loss incurred by Sir Robert H. Woods by the death of his son, Lieut. Thornley Woods, R.F.A., who was killed in action in France.

On the 15th March, 1917, a vote of condolence was passed with H.R.H. the Duke of Connaught, K.G., on the loss he had incurred by the death of his Consort.

On 15th March, 1917, a vote of condolence was passed with the family of the late Patrick W. Maxwell, F.R.C.S.I., for some time a member of the Council.

Votes of Congratulation.

On 19th March, 1916, the congratulations of the Council were conveyed to Professor W. Caldwell on obtaining the Degree of Doctor of Science of Dublin University, and the Fellowship of the Institute of Chemists, England.

On 15th February, 1917, the congratulations of the Council were conveyed to Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Thomas Myles, R.A.M.C., on receiving the Companionship of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath.

Restoration of Licentiate of Dental Surgery.

The name of Mr. J. Bulkeley Hughes has been restored to the College Roll of Licentiates in Dental Surgery.

The Irish Nursing Board.

The College being desirous of assisting the public to distinguish between competent and incompetent nurses, and of promoting the welfare of nurses, has assisted in constituting "The Irish Nursing Board."

Gifts to the College.

On the 21st December, 1916, Mr. H. Macnaughton-Jones, F.R.C.S.I., endowed a prize for annual competition, to be called "The Macnaughton-Jones Gold Medal for Obstetrics and Gynaecology." The cordial thanks of the Council were conveyed to Mr. Macnaughton-Jones for his generous gift.

1916 Through Mr. R. Lane-Joynt, F.R.C.S.I., the College was presented, by Mr. Joseph P. Lynch (Limerick), with the Diploma of Membership granted to Mr. Sylvester O'Halloran, and a copy of O'Halloran's Work on Amputation. The thanks of the Council were conveyed to the donors.

On January 18th, 1916, the portrait of the late Mr. Edward Hutton, who was President of the College in 1852, was presented to the College by Mr. Sydney Lupton, to whom a cordial vote of thanks was passed.

The Officers' Training Corps.

The efficiency of the Officers' Training Corps has been maintained during the year, and the band continues to prove a great help in the route marches.

During the Easter Recess the College was guarded by a contingent of the Officers' Training Corps.

Library.

Report of the Librarian.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to submit my Annual Report. The Library has been used by a large number of Students, Licentiates, Fellows of the College, and members of His Majesty's Royal Army Medical Corps.

Since my last Report the following Journals have been presented by the Editors:—British Dental Journal, Canada; Canadian Medical Association Journal, Journal of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, Proceedings and Transactions of the Royal Dublin Society, Proceedings and Transactions of the Royal Society of London, Transactions of the American Urological Association, Transactions of the Ophthalmological Society of the United Kingdom, Transactions of the American Associations of the Genito-Urinary Surgeons, Royal Naval Medical Service Journal.

The following were presented by the Royal Academy of Medicine, per J. Alfred Scott, F.R.C.S.I., Secretary:—Medical Magazine, Medical Review, Birmingham Review, Proceedings of the Royal Society of Medicine, Transactions of the American Surgical Association, Transactions of the Royal Academy of Medicine in Ireland.

The Calendars of the various Universities and licensing bodies have been received, and the College Calendar was sent in return.

Sir Charles Cameron presented a large number of Public Health Reports. About ninety volumes were bound, including thirty-five damaged during the Rebellion. Mr. John Knott, F.R.C.S.I., has also given a number of most interesting pamphlets.

Curator's Report.

GENTLEMEN,

Thanks to some re-arrangement and sorting of specimens, more use has been made of the Pathological Collection this year than heretofore. The difficulty of obtaining materials, glass, mounting fluids, &c, has made very little permanent mounting possible, although some twenty-one new specimens have been added, exclusive of a valuable collection of Epiphyses and other bones, presented to the Museum by Dr. John Knott. 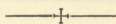
