**ANNUAL REPORT**

*5th May, 1960*—The first report of the year is of the grievous loss sustained by the College by the death of Mr. Frederick Gill, a Past-President and one who had always had the interests of the College very close to his heart.

*16th June, 1960*—Officers and Committees were chosen.

Professor D. Mitchell resigned his post of Professor of Pharmacology and Therapeutics. Dr. Barbara Stokes was appointed acting Professor for a period of six months. It was decided to appoint a part-time Professor for one year and consider the appointment thereafter of a full-time Professor.

X Mr. T. G. Wilson was appointed to the Lister Medal Committee.

Mr. J. H. Balmer was appointed to act with Mr. D. Montgomery on the Accident Services Committee.

It was agreed that the Honorary Fellowship of the Faculty of Anæsthetists be conferred on Dr. John Gillies, Sir Ivan Magill and Dr. Geoffrey Organe.

*14th July, 1960*—Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney was appointed to be a member of the General Medical Council from 14th October, 1960 to the 13th October, 1961.

Professor Kane was appointed College representative on the Medical Research Council.



Mr. T. O. Graham said that he would present a stained-glass window containing a picture of Abraham Colles for the Colles Rooms. The Council found this a most generous gesture.

*15th September, 1960*—The College asked that in the Federated Hospitals its medical school should be granted equal facilities to those granted to other schools.

*13th October, 1960*—Mr. B. P. Rooney was appointed Lecturer in Anatomy for a period of one year.

Professor J. François of Ghent was appointed to the Montgomery Lectureship for 1961.

*18th November, 1960*—At an extraordinary meeting it was decided to confer the Honorary Fellowship of the College on Dr. Isidor Schwaner Ravdin and Professor Edmund Prince Fowler, Jnr.

*8th December, 1960*—At this meeting it was decided to form a Faculty of Radiologists.

On the recommendation of the Royal College of Physicians Dr. Mervyn Abrahamson was elected as part-time Professor of Pharmacology and Therapeutics for a period of one year from April 1st, 1961.

The Dublin Painters were granted the use of the College from 1st to 26th August, 1961.

Messrs. Smith and Nephew most generously gave the College £500 for the purposes of the Pharmacology chair.

It was decided to have an Accident Symposium in 1961.

*12th January, 1961*—The first part of a Memorandum to be submitted to the Commission on Higher Education was approved for forwarding.

It was decided to award in September, 1961, Honorary Fellowships to Professor Erling Dahl-Iverson, Mr. Alton Ochsner, Professor Clarence Crafoord and Professor Boris Vassilevitch Petrovski.

June 3rd, 1961 was fixed as the date for the next conferring for the Faculty of Anæsthetists.

*9th February, 1961*—It was decided that in future the Final Fellowship may be taken in Ophthalmology.

Mr. C. K. Byrnes was given the use of the Banqueting Hall for a dinner on September 5th, 1961, to those taking part in the Surgical Trades Exhibition.

It was decided to re-decorate the Museum.

The Charter Day Dinner was held on February 11th.

*9th March, 1961*—Mr. John Seton Pringle having been appointed Regius Professor of Surgery at Trinity College, Dublin, resigned his post as Professor of Surgery to the Schools. His resignation was accepted, but with regret, because of the most valuable work he had done here.

Dr. Oliver Chance was re-appointed for a further period of five years as a Governor for the Imperial Cancer Research Fund.

Gifts for the Chair of Pharmacology were received: £2,000 from Messrs. Ethicon, £2,000 from Messrs. Johnson and Johnson and £1,000 from Messrs. Ortho Pharmaceuticals and for the General Purposes of the College, thirty guineas from Sir Clement Price-Thomas. These generous gifts are most deeply appreciated.

*16th March, 1961* (Extraordinary)—It was decided to confer the Honorary Fellowship of the College on the Right Honourable the Earl of Iveagh, K.G. and the Fellowship of the College ad eundem on Gilbert Marshall Irvine, F.R.C.S.ED., Professor of Anatomy.

It was decided to try and buy 38 York Street.

*13th April, 1961*—Messrs. Dublin Distillers made a welcome gift of £50 for the Pharmacology Chair.

Sir Stanford Cade most kindly gave the President a gavel and block for use at the Charter Day Dinner.

The Schools are to be visited by the Commission on Higher Education and by delegates from the Dental Board in May and by Inspectors from the Irish Registration Council and the General Medical Council in June.

*11th May, 1961*—Examiners in Court A and Court B were elected to take office on August 1st, 1961.

Mr. S. T. McCollum resigned from the Council because he is an applicant for a Professorship.
