

## ANNUAL REPORT.

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*Election of Hon. Librarian.*—On the 15th June, 1922, Mr. R. Bolton M'Causland was unanimously re-elected as Honorary Librarian.

*Vote of Sympathy from American College of Surgeons.*—On the 15th June, 1922, a letter was received from the American College of Surgeons regretting the recent great loss which the College had sustained in the death of its President, Dr. Edward H. Taylor.

*University of Padua.*—On the 15th June, 1922, Sir Robert H. Woods gave a most interesting account of his visit to the University of Padua as the representative of this College in connection with their celebrations. The President and Council conveyed their thanks to Sir Robert Woods.

*Guard in the College.*—On the 20th July, 1922, a special vote of thanks was passed to the Minister of Defence for sending a guard to take charge of the College during the recent disturbances in Dublin, and expressing the appreciation of the Council for the care they took of the property whilst in possession.

*Mary Louisa Prentice Montgomery Lectureship.*—On the 20th July, 1922, Professor Grafton Elliot Smith was asked to deliver the Mary Louisa Prentice Montgomery Lecture. The lecture was delivered on 29th January, 1923.

*Declaration by Mr. Story out of Order.*—On the 5th October, 1922, the President declared the election of Mr. Story null and void, as he had not taken the Declaration within the prescribed time, and ordered a new election.

On the 2nd November, 1922, Mr. Story took the Oath as a newly elected Member of Council.

*Disbandment of O.T.C.*—5th October, 1922. On the disbandment of the O.T.C., Colonel Mather and Sir Auckland

Geddes were written to to know what they wished done with the cups they were good enough to present for annual competition. Colonel Mather wished the cup returned to his London address, and Sir Auckland Geddes left it entirely to the discretion of the College as to how they would dispose of the cup.

*Incorporated Law Society, re use of room for lectures.*—19th October, 1922. The Council gave permission to the Incorporated Law Society to conduct their examinations and lectures in the College.

*Royal Dublin Society, re use of Examination Hall for juvenile Christmas lectures.*—2nd November, 1922. The Council gave permission to the Royal Dublin Society to hold their juvenile afternoon lectures in the Examination Hall.

*Portraits of the late Mr. Edward H. Taylor and Mr. William Stoker.*—2nd November, 1922. Portraits of Mr. Edward H. Taylor and Mr. William Stoker were presented to the College.

*Provisional Government, re nomination of a Representative for the Senate.*—16th November, 1922. Letter read from the Provisional Government asking the Council to nominate members for the first Seanad Eireann. It was decided to forward the names of the President and Sir Arthur Chance to the President of the Executive Council.

*Clinical Club, Royal Medical Benevolent Fund and Irish Medical Association, re use of Hall.*—7th December, 1922. The Council granted the use of the College to the Clinical Club, Royal Medical Benevolent Fund and Irish Medical Association, in connection with their meetings for the ensuing year.

*Vacant Chairs, Part-Time Professors.*—7th December, 1922. The Chairs of Medicine and Midwifery were declared vacant.

*St. Bartholomew's Hospital, delegate invited to attend celebrations of 800th anniversary.*—7th December, 1922. Invitation received from St. Bartholomew's Hospital asking the

Council to send a delegate to the celebrations in honour of the 800th anniversary of St. Bartholomew's Hospital. The President was nominated to represent the College.

*General Medical Council, election of representative.*—18th January, 1923. Sir Arthur Chance was unanimously elected as representative of the College on the General Medical Council.

*Resignation of Professor J. W. Bigger.*—18th January, 1923. Professor J. W. Bigger resigned the Professorship of Preventive Medicine and Forensic Medicine on his appointment as Professor of Bacteriology in Trinity College.

*Pathology Chair vacant.*—18th January, 1923. The President declared the Chair of Pathology vacant.

*Election of Professors of Medicine, of Midwifery, and of Preventive Medicine.*—15th March, 1923. F. C. Purser, F.R.C.P.I., was elected to the Chair of Medicine; E. Hastings Tweedy, F.R.C.P.I., was elected to the Chair of Midwifery and Gynæcology; V. M. Synge, F.R.C.P.I., was elected to the Chair of Preventive Medicine and Medical Jurisprudence.

*Election of Professor of Pathology.*—15th March, 1923. Dr. William Boxwell was elected Professor of Pathology.

*Portrait of the late Professor Mapother.*—15th March, 1923. Portrait of the late Professor Mapother was presented to the College by his daughter.

*Address of Welcome, Governor-General of Southern Ireland.*—15th March, 1923. It was unanimously decided to present an address of welcome to the Governor-General of Southern Ireland. The address was presented on the 1st May, the deputation consisting of:—

After the presentation, the deputation were entertained to lunch. The address was as follows:—

To His Excellency T. M. Healy, K.C., Governor-General of the Irish Free State.

May it please Your Excellency,

We, the President, Vice-President, and Council of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, wish to greet you on your appointment as the first Governor-General of the Irish Free State, and to express the earnest hope that your tenure of that high office may be both long and prosperous, and rendered illustrious by the establishment of peace and prosperity within the border of the Irish Free State.

Since its foundation in 1784 to the present date, the College has endeavoured to discharge its functions with efficiency, and as an educational body to fulfil its duties and obligations to the country. Its Fellows and Licentiates are found on the Staffs of nearly every Hospital in Ireland, and many hold leading positions in the great Medical and Scientific Institutions in the Colonies abroad.

We can assure Your Excellency that the services of our College will on all occasions be placed loyally and wholeheartedly at the disposal of the Government of the Irish Free State whenever questions arise affecting the public health or the welfare of the people.

DUBLIN, 1st May, 1923.

The reply of the Governor-General is as follows:—

Viceregal Lodge, Dublin.

Mr. President and Gentlemen of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland,

Your greetings on my appointment as the first Governor-General of the Irish Free State afford me great pleasure. They come at a time when it seems possible that tranquillity may be re-established within our borders.

Surgeons, no doubt, gain experience in warfare, but they can profit only by a guarded peace.

Your College has, as an educational body, discharged splendid functions. Nearly every Hospital in Ireland, and many abroad, have been strengthened by the attainments and zeal of its Licentiates and Fellows.

Irish surgeons are justly esteemed for their skill, originality, and courage wherever they practise. Medicine, leechcraft, and inoculative science daily win fresh triumphs over disease. The knowledge which is yours may, therefore, be regarded as the treasure house of the community.

I thank you for the assurance that your services can be counted on by the Irish Free State to aid it in preserving the public health and welfare of the common people.
