

Honorary Fellowship.

On February 1st the Council resolved to confer the Honorary Fellowship on Dr. Henri Hartmann (Paris), Surgeon-General Keogh, Director-General, Army Medical Staff, and on Dr. Almroth Ed. Wright. Surgeon-General Keogh and Dr. Wright were present at the Annual Dinner; and previous to the dinner the President conferred on them the Honorary Fellowship of the College in the presence of the Lord Lieutenant, the Fellows, and Guests. Dr. Hartmann was unable to attend owing to illness, and in his case the Diploma was granted *in absentia*.

Dr. Wright gave an address on Therapeutic Inoculation to the Fellows and Licentiates in the Examination Hall on the following Monday.

Alteration of Bye-Law No. 9.

On March 15 the Council resolved—

That Bye-Law No. 9, as modified in 1897, be further altered as follows:—
After the words “Fellows or Licentiates of the College,” insert the words “or Professors or Lecturers in any School of Medicine recognised by the College.”

This alteration was submitted to a General Meeting of the Fellows on March 28, and was unanimously approved of. It has since received the sanction of the Lord Lieutenant.

The Bye-Law now stands as follows:—

“Graduates of any University, which may be from time to time recognised by the College, shall be eligible for election as Examiners in the subjects of General Education, as specified in the lists mentioned in the foot-note.* All the other Examiners shall be Fellows or Licentiates of the College, or Professors or Lecturers in any School of Medicine recognised by the College.”

- *1. English Language, including Grammar and Composition.
2. Latin, including Grammar, translation from specified authors, and translation of easy passages, not taken from such authors.
3. Mathematics, comprising (a) Arithmetic; (b) Algebra, as far as Simple Equations, inclusive; (c) Geometry, the subject-matter of Euclid, Books I, II, III, with easy deductions.
4. One of the following optional subjects:—
(a) Greek; (b) French; (c) German; (d) Italian; (e) Any other Modern Language; (f) Logic.

Dated at Dublin Castle this 6th day of April, 1906.

ABERDEEN.

The Incorporated Society for Promoting the Higher Education and Training of Nurses.

A number of gentlemen endeavoured to obtain from the Board of Trade a license to incorporate themselves as a society under the above title. The Irish Nurses' Association requested the Council to oppose the granting of this license.

The Council appointed the President and Vice-President to attend the inquiry held in London on May 5th, 1905. The President was unable to go, and the Vice-President (Mr. Swanzy) attended and opposed the granting of the license. On June 7th a letter was received from the Board of Trade stating that the matter would stand over until the Bill before Parliament for the Registration of Nurses had been disposed of. The Council requested the Board to give them an opportunity of being heard should the matter be re-opened.

Barker Prize for 1904.

This prize was awarded to Mr. T. A. Burke. A special prize was also given to Mr. J. B. Kelly.

Army Medical Service.

In September the Director-General of the Army Medical Staff asked the Council to express their opinion as to whether varicocele rendered a candidate for a commission physically unfit.

The Council replied that, in their opinion, candidates affected with varicocele may be admitted to His Majesty's Service save those in whom the varicocele has produced either a definite elongation of the cord or an obvious atrophy of the testis, and that all cases of varicocele may be admitted if effectually operated on.

Imperial Cancer Research Fund.

The President of the College for the time being was appointed to represent the College on the Committee of that body.

Meetings held in the College.

The Council granted the use of the College for meetings of the Royal Academy of Medicine in Ireland, the Irish Medical Association, the Clinical Club, the Irish Branch of the British Dental Association, the Medical Benevolent Fund, the Medical Temperance Society, and the King's Coronation National Fund for Nurses in Ireland.
