ANNUAL REPORT

14th May, 1959—The Trustees of the Welcome Trust made a grant to the College of £850 as a contribution towards the construction and equipment of the Colles Rooms.

11th June, 1959—The Council sanctioned the expenditure of £1,500 for the improvement of the histology department.

The resignation of Mr. Arnold K. Henry, F.R.C.S.I. from the Professorship in Anatomy was accepted. He was thanked for all the good work he had done for the schools during the past twelve years.

9th July, 1959—Mr. Gilbert Marshall Irvine, F.R.C.S.ED. was elected as Professor of Anatomy and Mr. A. K. Henry was made Emeritus Professor.

Fourteen Chippendale chairs were bought for the Colles Rooms.

8th October, 1959—Dr. MacClancy and the Association of Graduates gave the College a very fine table for the Colles Rooms and promised to have installed a stained glass window, incorporating the College Arms.

Sir Archibald McIndoe was invited to give a Colles Lecture entitled "Total reconstruction of the face in burns."

Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney was appointed to the G.M.C. for the period 14th October, 1959 to 13th October, 1960.

12th November, 1959—The Council agreed to the appointment of Chaplains to act as helpers and advisers to students: subsequently their Graces, the Archbishops respectively named the Rev. M. B. Crowe (R.C.) and Rev. R. H. Dowse (C. of I.).

At this meeting the Faculty of Anaesthetists was started with the formation of a board of the Faculty.

Dr. T. Gilmartin was appointed as Dean and Dr. V. O. McCormick Vice-Dean. The members of the board were named—with Mr. D. J. Riordan to act as Council member.

Mr. Ion Simpson Hall was invited to give a Colles Lecture in the Spring on the subject of "Cancer of the Larynx and the neck."

10th December, 1959—The Council decided to give the Honorary Fellowship to Sir Stanford Cade, K.B.E., C.B.,

14th January, 1960—It was decided to offer two scholarships each year to be awarded on the results of the Preliminary Examination in general education. The scholarships are to take the form of the remission of all fees including hospital and examination fees for the full period of six years. The Francis Nolan's Scholarship is confined to children of Irish Dental or Medical Graduates: the Arthur Jacob Scholarship is open to all.

A College Faculty of Dental Surgery was formed. The first members were the President, Mr. R. A. Stoney, Mr. A. B. Clery, Mr. N. Kinnear, Dr. J. F. Owens, Dr. R. B. Dockrell and Dr. T. O'Looney.

Mr. D. Montgomery and Mr. Fenton were appointed representatives on the Accident Service Committee organised by the British Orthopædic Association.

12th February, 1960—The status of lectureship in Pædiatrics was raised to that of a Professorship with Professor Dundon as the first occupant of the Chair.

10th March, 1960—Messrs. Ethicon made a further generous gift to the College for the decoration of the Examination Hall.

A draft report on the curriculum for the G.M.C. was prepared for the consideration of a joint committee of the two Colleges.

Mr. R. S. Handley, F.R.C.S., Chairman of the Board of Examiners of the English College was appointed external examiner in Surgery for the Final Professional Examination.

An Academic Committee was formed to replace the Advisory Committee. It consists of all Professors, together with Mr. Kinnear and Mr. Clery.

The Council suffered a severe loss in the early months of 1960 by the deaths of Mr. Bouchier-Hayes and Mr. Frederick Gill.

REPORT OF THE LIBRARY

For the year ending 5th April, 1960.

The total number of books and periodicals used during the year by Fellows, Licentiates, and students was 12,250.

The customary periodicals were received and books were acquired by purchase and donation.

Donors of Books included:—

The Commonwealth Fund, New York; The representative of the late Mr. J. L. Keegan, F.R.C.S.I.; The representatives of the late Mr. Frederick Gill, F.R.C.S.I. Mrs. F. S. Bourke (who also gave a large number of surgical instruments collected by her late husband and by Dr. T. P. C. Kirkpatrick, and a handsome Leech Jar).

In September 1959, the Annual Conference of the Medical Section of the Library Association (London) was held in Dublin. The proceedings included an afternoon visit to the College Library, during which the Librarian gave a brief account of the College and had on view an Exhibition consisting of books and documents relating to Irish Surgery. The fifty visitors from Medical Libraries in Great Britain and Ireland, were received by Mr. Adams McConnell, F.R.C.S.I. (in the absence of the President) and tea was later provided. A letter of appreciation and thanks was received from the Secretary of the Section.

At the request of Dr. L. B. Somerville Large, President of the Ophthalmological Society of Ireland, the Librarian prepared an extensive Exhibition illustrating the history of ophthalmology in Ireland. It was viewed in the Examination Hall by members of the Society and their guests met in the College for their Annual dinner. The exhibition was correlated with Dr. Large's Inaugural Address (on Irish work on diseases of the Eye) which was given on the same afternoon in Trinity College.

ANNUAL REPORT ON THE MUSEUM, 1959-60

The Cardex File system which was begun last year has proved of great benefit to students and post graduates using the Museum as it gives such detailed accounts of each specimen.

Every specimen in the Museum was thoroughly cleaned and the shelves and press doors also cleaned and polished during the recent Easter Holiday. The results have been very satisfactory.

Further specimens from the McNaughton-Jones collections were added to the Specimens.

A large number of unmounted specimens were received from the following Hospitals:—

Mercer's Hospital, Dublin. St. Anne's Skin and Cancer Hospital, Dublin. City Skin and Cancer Hospital, Dublin. County Hospital, Monaghan. St. Nesson's Orthopædic Hospital, Croom, Co. Limerick.

The cataloguing of the specimens is continuing very slowly.
