10th July, 1952.—Mr. A. K. Henry, F.R.C.S.I., was re-elected Professor of Anatomy for a period of five years and Mr. G. M. Irvine, F.R.C.S. (ED.) was re-elected for five years as Senior Demonstrator in Anatomy.

Gifts were received from Mr. G. Ward of a replica of a dental instrument and from Mr. J. D. Cunningham, Fellow, and the relatives of Emil Stone, a deceased student, of text books for use in the Library.

11th July, 1952.—The Honorary Fellowship of the College was conferred on Sir Geoffrey Jefferson.

9th October, 1952.—Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney was appointed to be a member of the General Medical Council for the term of one year from 1st October, 1952 and was nominated to be a member of the Medical Registration Council for the term of five years from 24th October, 1952.

Dr. Rory O'Hanlon was appointed demonstrator in Midwifery in place of Dr. Fleming.

It was decided to buy Sir William Blundon's surgical instruments for the Museum.

13th November, 1952.—The Council expressed its sorrow at the death of Henry Sords Meade, Licentiate, Past President and Councillor of the College.

It was decided to award the Honorary Fellowship of the College to Sir Gordon Gordon-Taylor, K.B.E., C.B., F.R.C.S., on February 14th, 1953 at the Charter Day Dinner.

An arrangement has been made whereby the Library of the Royal Victoria Eye and Ear Hospital has been received on permanent loan by the College Library and its volumes are available for use by Fellows and Licentiates.

Gifts were received from J. Horowitz of a specimen of Morton's Ophthalmoscope and from Mrs. Jacob, Templemore, of an oil painting of John Jacob and other relics of John Jacob and his brother Arthur.

11th December, 1952.—Lt. Col. O'Gorman Kirwan was invited to be Montgomery Lecturer for 1953.

8th January, 1953.—The Council paid tribute to the memory of Arthur Steevens French O'Carrol, Licentiate and Councillor of the College.

Lt. Col. O'Gorman Kirwan being unable to deliver the Montgomery Lecture, Prof. Marc Amsler of Zurich was appointed in his place.

Mr. Alban Gee, Fellow, reported that he had represented this College and presented an address at the installation of Viscount Bruce as First Chancellor of the Australian National University.

The President, The Secretary and the Registrar were empowered to write to the American Medical Association on the subject of a visitation to the Schools.

Mr. R. P. Smyth, Fellow, sent another gift to the Library and Mr. G. Ward sent some more replicas of old Dental instruments.

12th March, 1953.—Prof. Jessop having accepted a post in Trinity College tendered his resignation of the Post of Professor of Physiology, a position which he has held for twenty-four years. The resignation was accepted and Prof. Jessop was thanked for all the good service he has given.

A meeting of the College was held and Prof. Frank Kane of University College, Cork, was elected to the Professorship of Physiology of the College.

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Messrs. M. P. Burke, R. A. Stoney, Wm. Doolin, T. O. Graham and Wm. Pearson were elected members of the Nomination Committee in respect of the Cultural and Educational Panel of the Senate.

The Council has almost completed the purchase of number 33 York Street and enquiries are on foot regarding the possibility of buying 34 York Street.

The Primary Fellowship Examination is now held twice a year instead of three times: the dates of the examinations have been altered to the second week in February and the first week in July. Before each of these examinations there will be a four months course organised for intending Candidates by the Departments of Anatomy, Pathology and Physiology.
