

ANNUAL REPORT.

June, 1930.—Mr. W. C. P. Smyly was unanimously re-elected as Hon. Librarian.

The winner of the Richard Dancer Purefoy Memorial Prize submitted account of her work in America. It was approved by the Council.

July, 1930.—The Council decided to grant the use of the Examination Hall in connection with the Eucharistic Congress to be held in 1932.

September, 1930.—It is with profound regret that the Council records the loss they have sustained through the death of their friend and colleague, Mr. Robert Charles Butler Maunsell. He was a past President of the College, and representative of the College at the Saorstát Medical Registration Council. It was mainly through his efforts that a settlement was effected in the momentous crisis in connection with the establishment of the Medical Register. He had a very distinguished career. He served in France as Surgical Specialist with the Dublin 83 General Hospital with the rank of Major.

Resignation of the Professor of Medicine.—Dr. G. E. Nesbitt, who had held the office of Professor of Medicine, resigned, and the Council placed on record their appreciation of his services during his term of office.

November, 1930.—Dr. J. D. H. Widdess was appointed as Assistant to the Professor of Physiology.

Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney, President of the College, was elected to represent the College at the meetings of the Saorstát Medical Registration Council and the Irish Dental Board.

Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney was appointed to represent the College at the meetings of the Committee of Management.

December, 1930.—Resignation of Professor Synge. Dr. Synge resigned the post of Professor of Preventive Medicine and Medical Jurisprudence.

Dr. V. M. Synge was appointed Professor of Medicine.

Officers' Training Corps.—The Council decided to forward to the Minister for Defence a petition received from the students with regard to the formation of an Officers' Training Corps. The Minister for Defence welcomed the suggestion, and an Officers' Training Corps is now in full working order.

January, 1931.—Sir William Taylor was elected to represent the College at the meetings of the General Medical Council.

February, 1931.—Professor of Preventive Medicine and Medical Jurisprudence.—Dr. Geoffrey Bewley was elected.

Invitation received from the University of Leeds, asking the College to send a representative to their Centenary Celebrations. The President of the College, Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney, was nominated.

March, 1931.—The Council gave formal permission to a Committee of students for a revival of the Biological Association.

Hon. Fellowships.—The Council decided to grant Honorary Fellowships to Dr. G. E. Armstrong, of Montreal, and Sir Hugh M. Rigby, Surgeon to His Majesty the King. The conferring to take place early in June.

Museum,

GENTLEMEN,

I beg to submit the following report from the Museum for the past year:—

Rather more time has been devoted to demonstrating the naked-eye changes of morbid anatomy, so that more exhaustive study of the specimens illustrative of the subject-matter of the lectures has been made than heretofore. This aspect of the course in Pathology has been materially facilitated through the assistance freely given by Dr. Lewis (honorary demonstrator), as well as by the kindness of Mr. Garvey, who has restored to the Museum one volume of the original catalogue of specimens. Through these agencies about 100 specimens of cardiovascular disease have been identified and set in order, and many of them were used for purposes of demonstration. It is hoped that this work will be carried on a further stage during the summer months.

In the matter of new specimens added to the collection, Mr. Clery has given a good deal of material for section.
