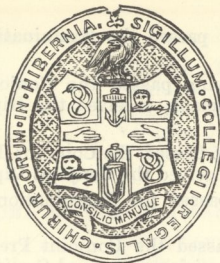

## College.

### *New Examination Hall.*

This Hall has been completed at a total cost of £2,819 17s. 11d. (including heating, lighting by electric light, ventilating-fan, a lift, and a clock), and has been in use for some months. The flat portion of the roof, which was greatly injured by the storm two years ago, has been covered with new lead and completely repaired.

A cloak-room and lavatory have been provided for the use of female candidates.

### *Lighting of the College and School.*

The electric current for the lighting of the College and School is now supplied by the Dublin Corporation; hitherto it was produced by the College. A considerable economy will result from the change.

### *Honorary Fellowship.*

On December 1st, 1904, the Council passed the following resolution :—

That the Honorary Fellowship of the College be conferred on Anthony Traill, Esq., M.D., LL.D., the first medical man appointed Provost of Trinity College.

The President admitted Dr. Traill to the Fellowship, and presented him with the Honorary Diploma on February 25th. Dr. Traill, F.R.C.S.I., *Honoris Causâ*, was present at the College Dinner.

### *Carmichael Prize Essay.*

At the first meeting of the Council in July the Secretary submitted eight essays.

The Prize was awarded to Michael Foster Reaney, M.B., Lond.

### *Barker Prize for 1904.*

This Prize was awarded to Mr. Charles Cooper, a student in the College School.

### *Election of Representative of the College on the General Medical Council.*

On November 3rd a letter was submitted to the Council from Sir C. Ball, stating that he would not again seek election.

The Council passed the following resolution :—

That the President, Vice-President, and Council have heard with great regret of Sir C. Ball's determination not to offer himself for re-election as their representative on the General Medical Council, and tender him their most



hearty thanks for the earnestness and ability with which he has on all occasions defended the interests of the College, for the loyal manner in which he has given expression to the wishes of their body during the recent debates on Medical Education, and the modifications of the curriculum proposed by the London Colleges.

At the first meeting in February, Sir T. Myles was elected to represent the College for the ensuing year.

#### *Restoration of a Licentiate.*

On December 13th the Council resolved to remove the suspension of the letters-testimonial of Mr. S. B. Shekleton, and to restore his name to the list of Licentiates.

His letters-testimonial were suspended and his name removed in 1899.

#### *Meetings held in the College.*

The Council granted the use of the College for meetings of the Royal Academy of Medicine in Ireland, the Irish Medical Association, the Clinical Club, the Irish Branch of the British Dental Association, the Medical Benevolent Fund, the Medical Temperance Society.

The Council also granted the use of the Albert Hall to the Society for the Prevention of Intemperance, on January 10th, 1905, to entertain at breakfast Dr. G. S. Woodhead, President of the Association.

#### *The Incorporated Dental Hospital of Ireland.*

The Council, having received a petition from the students attending this hospital, held an inquiry, and having heard statements from the representatives of the staff of the hospital, passed the following resolution :—

The Council are in the main content with the statement made by the members of the staff of the Dental Hospital on the subject of the teaching to students given at that hospital, and trust that they will endeavour to fill certain wants in it which they themselves acknowledged to exist.

#### *Librarian.*

Mr. M'Causland was elected Librarian in succession to Mr. Swanzy, who had been elected Vice-President.

#### *Vote of Congratulation.*

On July 7th the Council passed the following vote :—

That the cordial congratulations of this Council be offered to Sir K. Franks, a former Vice-President of the College, on the honour of knighthood recently conferred on him by His Majesty.

#### *College Dinner.*

The Annual Dinner was held in the Examination Hall on February 25th.

## Museum.

### *Report of the Curator.*

GENTLEMEN,—I have the honour to report that the Museum still continues to be largely used by the Examiners and Professors of the College.

The task of remounting and renumbering the specimens in the Pathological Museum has been interrupted by the work of arranging the Natural History and other specimens which have been permanently transferred to the Pathological Museum. Three heads of male Irish Elks have been repaired, mounted on shields, and, with seventeen heads of other animals similarly mounted, have been placed round the Gallery. The Invertebrates, Fishes, Amphibia, and Reptiles, Birds, and all mammalian skulls have been classified and arranged in the cases on the floor of the Museum to the left. The skeletons of the Mammalia have for the most part been suitably arranged according to Orders on the floor of the Museum. The Primates have, however, been placed in the remaining side cases to the left. As time permits, it is proposed to take down, clean, and remount all the skeletons. The following large skeletons have already been dealt with in this fashion:—Whale, Dolphin, Samboe deer, Camel, and Gnu.

The Northumberland Wax Collection and the Barker Anatomical Prize Dissections have been placed under the care of Professor Fraser.

The new specimens added during the year were presented by Dr. Bleyer (Brazil), Dr. Craig, Professor Sir John Moore, Professor Scott, Professor Stoker, and Mr. W. Taylor.
