REPORT.

July, 1943.—Dr. M. H. O'Connor was elected Professor of Pathology in succession to the late Professor William Boxwell.

Dr. J. B. McArevey was appointed Montgomery Lecturer for 1944.

A valuable demonstration skull, the property of the late Commander Henry Hurst, R.N., who lost his life in H.M.S. Hood, was accepted with gratitude from Mrs. Hurst.

October, 1943.—Professor R. F. J. Henry, F.R.C.S.I., was re-elected additional Professor of Surgery

Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney was re-elected to represent the College on the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of the United Kingdom.

February, 1944.—Mr. John Read Cowle presented a large collection of surgical instruments dating chiefly from the middle of the last century and much of which was made by the Dublin firm of John Read & Son.

May, 1944.—The Executors of the late Sir. W. I. de Courcy Wheeler, Fellow and Past-President of the College, offered to the College and the College accepted the bequest of Sir William's medical books together with a large bookcase belonging to the late Surgeon Butcher. The books will form the Wheeler-Butcher library in memory of Sir William's father and his master. A sum of £100 is also included in the bequest, and with this it is intended to institute a memorial to Sir William in the form of a medal for some branch of surgery.

Library.

GENTLEMEN,

From the 1st April, 1943, to 31st March, 1944, 4,037 books and periodicals were borrowed.

The usual journals were received. Books were added, by donation and by purchase.

The following donations were received:—

Mrs. W. Boxwell.—Over 100 volumes on medicine and pathology, from the late Professor W. Boxwell's library.

The Students' Union.—A donation of £26 for the purchase of books.

The Trustees of the Carmichael Prize Essay Fund.—Copies of the Carmichael Essay, 1943, on "The State of Medicine in Ireland," by Dr. Robert Collis.

The above donations are very much appreciated, and it is to be hoped that the Library may benefit further by such means in the future.

Binding and repairing of rare books still proceeds. The results of this work may now be seen in the Fellows' Room book cases.

Two exhibitions of rare books were arranged, one in connection with the 400th anniversary of the publication of Vesalius' "De Fabrica," the other illustrating the history of Bright's Disease.

The collection of Medical and Surgical Pamphlets and Inaugural Theses in the Library is of particular interest for the medical historian. Such publications are often printed in small numbers, and are less likely than books to be preserved, unless bound together in book form. Thus an extensive collection of them may be of great value. But to be of service too it must be indexed, and no index of our collection was known to exist until recently, when two manuscript indexes, compiled in a beautifully neat hand by Humphrey Minchin, F.R.C.S.I., were discovered. They are dated 1858.

Minchin was born at Longford in 1816. He studied in the College Schools and at Trinity College, Dublin, and became L.R.C.S.I. in 1838, M.B. in 1840. He was Professor of Botany in the College Schools from 1867-1889. As a musician his name survives among those who have composed musical settings for the Church of Ireland service for which

he wrote 50 double chants, which bear his initials, 'H.M.' Other compositions by him include Cathedral Services, anthems, and vocal quartets and solos. He died in 1900.

Minchin's index includes only the large series of Pamphlets already in the Library in 1858. Many have been added since then, and this index needs extension to include the later additions.

Museum.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to submit the following report on the Museum for the year 1944.

Specimens were placed at the disposal of Examiners in other subjects as in previous years.

Mounting jars, fixing and preserving solutions are almost unobtainable. One is therefore obliged to use discretion in adding specimens to the Museum.

The following specimens considered necessary for teaching purposes were added during the year as mounted specimens :—

- (1) Chorion Epithelioma of Uterus.
- (2) Hydatidiform Mole in Uterus.
- (3) Placenta Accreta in Uterus.
- (4) Teratoma of Ovary.
- (5) Struma Ovarii.
- (6) Pyosalpinx.

Acknowledgment is due to the Master of the National Maternity Hospital and to the pathologist of that Hospital (Dr. Geoghegan) for these specimens.

The following were added from the Richmond Hospital through the interest of Mr. McConnell from cases which I dealt with :—

- (7) Glioblastoma Cerebri.
- (8) Cerebral Abscess.
- (9) Cerebral Hæmorrhage.

A number of other specimens were added as gross unmounted specimens for handling by the students.

On most class days mounted or unmounted specimens were brought from the Richmond Hospital to illustrate the lectures.

During the year unwanted specimens of Zoological and allied nature were offered to the National Museum, to Trinity College and to University College, Dublin. None of these bodies availed of this offer, so it is proposed to dismount and discard the specimens—they are largely unidentifiable—recover and if possible use the spirit and store or perhaps sell the jars. These latter are of a kind not usually used nowadays, and may not be saleable.

It is intended to forward a later report on the Department of Pathology as a whole—which may contain further suggestions concerning the Museum.
