The College.

Honours.

During the year the following honours have been conferred upon Fellows and Licentiates of the College :—

The honour of Knighthood was conferred by His Majesty the King upon Mr. Robert H. Woods, Past President of the College.

The Arnott Memorial Medal was awarded for gallantry in Northern Nigeria to Mr. Patrick J. Garland, C.M.G., a Licentiate of the College.

The degree of M.Ch. (*honoris causa*) was conferred by the University of Dublin upon Sir Robert H. Woods, F.R.C.S.

The Royal College of Physicians of Ireland elected Sir Arthur Chance, F.R.C.S., an Honorary Fellow.

By-Law No. 9 Amended.

At the Council meeting held on April 2nd, 1914, it was resolved to amend By-Law No. 9, owing to the difficulty of securing a Fellow or Licentiate competent to examine in Engineering and Architecture for the D.P.H. The amended By-Law now reads :—

9. Graduates of any University, which may be from time to time recognized by the College, shall be eligible for election as Examiners in the subjects of General Education, as specified in the lists mentioned in the foot-note,* and also as Examiners in connexion with the Examinations for the Diploma in Public Health in the subjects of Engineering and Architecture.

All the other Examiners shall be Fellows or Licentiates of the College, or Professors or Lecturers in any School of Medicine recognized by the College.

2. Latin, including Grammar, translation from specified authors, and translation of easy passages, not taken from such authors.

3. Mathematics, comprising (a) Arithmetic; (b) Algebra, as far as Simple Equations, inclusive; (c) Geometry, the subject-matter of Euclid, Books I, II, III, with easy deductions.

4. One of the following optional subjects :— (a) Greek; (b) French; (c) German; (d) Italian; (e) any other modern language; (f) Logic.

The By-Law was approved by His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant on 16th April, 1914.

*1. English Language, including Grammar and Composition.

Resignation of Professor A. Campbell Geddes.

Professor Geddes having resigned the Professorship of Anatomy on his appointment to the Professorship of Anatomy in McGill University, Montreal, the following resolution was unanimously adopted at the Council meeting held on June 27th, 1913 :—

That the President, Vice-President, and Council have received with great regret the intimation of Professor Geddes's retirement, and desire to put on record their high appreciation of the efforts he has made so unceasingly and so successfully to raise the standard of Anatomical knowledge amongst the Students of the School, and to wish him every success in his career in the future.

Election of a Professor of Anatomy.

At the Council meeting on 31st July, 1913, Mr. Evelyn John Evatt, M.B., BAC. SURG., Univ. Durham, was elected Professor of Anatomy.

The Barker Anatomical Prize for 1913.

This Prize was awarded to Mr. D. V. O'Connor, a pupil in the College School.

Election of Honorary Librarian.

Mr. Bolton M'Causland was re-elected Honorary Librarian.

Election of Secretary to the Council.

On the 5th June Mr. Charles M. Benson was re-elected Secretary to the Council.

Representation of the College on the General Medical Council.

On February 5th Sir Lambert Ormsby was elected to represent the College on the General Medical Council for one year.

Election of Examiner vice Professor Geddes, resigned.

On November 20th Professor E. J. Evatt was elected Examiner in Anatomy on Court A and Court B, to act until the following May.

Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction.

The Council have pleasure in stating that an increased grant was obtained this year from the above Department in support of the College School.

Memorial to Lord Lister.

At a Council meeting held on the 14th August, a donation of Twenty Guineas was voted to the Fund being raised to erect a Memorial in London to the late Lord Lister, an Honorary Fellow of the College.

The Schools of Surgery.

During the year considerable improvements have been carried out in the Schools, including the reconstruction of the Chemical Laboratory, whereby greater facilities for practical work and increased accommodation have been provided.

National Health Insurance Act.

After conferring with the Royal College of Physicians on the subject of Certification under the National Health Insurance Act, the following resolutions submitted by the Conference Committee were adopted by the Council on November 20th :—

RESOLVED : That in the opinion of the Royal Colleges of Physicians and Surgeons, Ireland, the existing arrangements for obtaining evidence of incapacity, entitling to benefit under the National Insurance (1911) Act, have given rise to serious abuses.

In forming a judgment as to whether a person is "incapable of work," it is essential, alike in the interests of the public and of the claimant, that the fullest possible information as to the medical condition of the claimant should be before the person whose duty it is to adjudicate on the claim. This information is, as a rule, in the possession only of the claimant's medical attendant.

The Colleges are of opinion that medical certificates under the Insurance Act should be accepted only if given by the claimant's medical attendant, if any, unless such medical attendant refuses to certify.

If the Body claimed against desires to review a certificate, the Colleges are of opinion that the medical referee should have before him the certificate originally given by the claimant's medical attendant, and should give such medical attendant sufficient notice of the time and place of examination, and an opportunity of stating the grounds on which he arrived at the opinion expressed in his certificate.

RESOLVED : That the manner in which the duties of the office of "Medical Adviser," either to the Insurance Commissioners, or Approved Societies, are being discharged at present in many parts of Ireland is contrary to medical ethics, and deserving of punishment by the Colleges.

On 19th April the Council adopted the following resolution with reference to National Health Insurance (Medical Benefit) Regulations, 1913 :—

The College observes with regret that in Section 44 (2) of the National Health Insurance (Medical Benefit) Regulations, 1913, and the Memorandum issued in connexion therewith, provision is made whereby insured persons who

make their own arrangements for medical benefit under Section 15 (3) of the National Insurance Act may obtain treatment from non-qualified persons.

Hitherto none but duly qualified medical practitioners have been employed, as such, in any public capacity; and the College deplores that, under an Act professing to promote the health of the nation, recognition should be given and provision made for the payment of public money to a class of persons who have not obtained a legal qualification to practise medicine, and concerning whose medical knowledge there exists no sort of guarantee.

On October 23rd the following resolution was adopted by the Council:—

That this Council of the Royal College of Surgeons, having investigated specific ethical cases referred to it by the Dublin County Borough Local Medical Committee, is of opinion that any Fellow or Licentiate of the College who knowingly visits, examines, or otherwise interferes in a professional capacity with patients without the knowledge and consent of the medical attendant is guilty of unprofessional and "infamous" conduct.

Exclusion of Candidates for Honorary Positions on Staffs of Public Hospitals.

The following resolution was adopted at the meeting of Council held on February 19th, 1914:—

RESOLVED: That the present exclusion of all persons who do not hold certain qualifications from candidature for honorary positions on the Staff of a public hospital is contrary to the public weal, and is a restriction which is not to the interest of the Institution itself, excluding, as it does, all other candidates who may have exceptional claims to fill such positions.

Meetings held in the College.

The Council granted the use of the College for meetings of the Royal Academy of Medicine in Ireland, the Irish Medical Association, Royal Medical Benevolent Fund Society, the Clinical Club, the Irish Branch of the British Dental Association, the Association of Fellows, the King's Coronation National Fund for Nurses, and the Dublin County Borough Medical Committee.

Charter Day Dinner.

On February 11th the Annual Charter Day Dinner, which was largely attended, was held in the Examination Hall. His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, the Earl of Aberdeen, honoured the College by his presence.

Library.

Report of the Librarian.

GENTLEMEN,—I have the honour to submit my Annual Report. The Library has been used by a larger number of students than in previous years. Every student is now required to fill up a docket before he obtains a book. This new arrangement works well, and is a useful check.

Since my last Report the following Journals were presented by the Editors:—The British Dental Journal, The Post-Graduate Course Journal, The Canadian Medical Association Journal, The West London Medical Journal, Journal of the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, The Journal of the Irish Medical Association, The London University Gazette, Proceedings and Transactions of the Royal Irish Academy, Proceedings and Transactions of the Royal Dublin Society, Proceedings and Transactions of the Royal Society of London.

The following were presented by the Royal Academy of Medicine, Ireland, per J. Alfred Scott, F.R.C.S., Secretary:—The Medical Review, The Medical Magazine, The Bristol Medico-Chirurgical Journal, The Birmingham Medical Review, The Australasian Medical Gazette, Revue de Chirurgie de Paris, Bulletin de L'Académie Royale de Médecine de Belgique, Journal de Chirurgie et Annales de la Société Belge de Chirurgie, Proceedings of the Royal Society of Medicine, Transactions of the American Surgical Association, Transactions of the Royal Academy of Medicine in Ireland.

The various Licensing bodies, Universities, &c., have most kindly contributed their Calendars; and the College has reciprocated by sending its Calendar in return.

Sir Charles A. Cameron, C.B., and Mr. H. Macnaughton Jones have, as on many previous occasions, contributed to the Library.

During the year the College acquired by purchase what is practically a unique collection of Anatomical books, viz.—part of the collection of the late Professor Alexander Fraser, as well as some collected by his successor in office. These books now form a departmental library, and are placed for convenience in the rooms allotted to the Professor of Anatomy, and are under his control and care.
