REPORT

April 8th, 1954—It was decided to set up a Faculty of Medicine in the Schools and to appoint a Dean of the Faculty. Later Professor O'Connor was appointed Dean.

A joint Committee from the Education Committee and the Faculty was established.

The new Dental Curriculum was approved.

May 13th, 1954—Examiners in Court A and Court B were elected.

It was decided to entertain the Physiological Society in July.

June 10th, 1954—Committees were appointed. Mr. William Doolin was elected to the Committee for the Lister Medal.

A presentation was made to Mr. M. P. Burke to commemorate his Presidency.

July 8th, 1954—A Faculty of Dentistry was created in the Schools. The University of London recognised the Schools for a further period of six years for preparation for the M.B., B.S. Degree Examinations for external students.

October 14th, 1954—Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney was appointed a member of the General Medical Council for a period of one year.

It was decided to have a meeting of representatives of the three Royal Colleges and the Royal Faculty in Dublin in 1955.

November 11th, 1954—Professor David Mitchell was elected to the Council for Medical Research of Ireland for four years.

December, 9th, 1954—Dr. H. Arruga was elected Montgomery Lecturer for 1955.

January 13th, 1955—Professor Charles Wells was elected as extern examiner in Surgery.

March 10th, 1955—Dr. Oliver Chance was nominated a Representative Governor of the Imperial Cancer Research Fund for three years.

The Lectureship in Biology was raised to a Professorship.


