ANNUAL REPORT.

Election of Honorary Librarian.—On the 12th July Mr. A. A. M'Connell was unanimously elected as Honorary Librarian.

Royal Dublin Society.—The Council granted the use of the Examination Hall to the Royal Dublin Society for the holding of juvenile and afternoon lectures.

Inspection of Examinations.—The Council approved of the recommendation of the Committee of Management, as follows:—“That it be recommended to the Colleges that, for the future, the visitation of the Conjoint Examinations be given up, and that questions relative to the Examinations be referred to the last Chairman of the Conjoint Committee. Further, that for the future the schedules for the examinations be examined and vouched for by a single member of the Committee instead of by the entire Committee, and that the Examiners be requested to report to the Committee of Management whenever they think necessary.”

Psychological Medicine.—On the 10th July the Council approved of the holding of a Conjoint Examination in connection with the Diploma in Psychological Medicine, six examiners to be appointed, and the expenses to be divided equally between the two Colleges.

Presentation to the College.—Mrs. Bertha Johnston presented an account of the examination of the body of Napoleon after his death at Saint Helena, with other medical information. It was addressed to the late Charles Hawkes Todd, a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland.

Death of Mr. A. W. Baker.—On the 10th of July the Council passed a resolution of sympathy with Mrs. Baker and the members of her family on the death of Mr. A. W. Baker, F.R.C.S.I., Member of the Council.

The Clerk of the Dublin Union wrote asking the College to appoint a representative to confer with representatives of the National University and Trinity College in the selection and appointment of Medical Doctors to Dispensaries in Dublin. Sir Arthur Chance was appointed.

Irish Dental Association.—On the 13th November the Irish Dental Association asked the Council to nominate a representative to confer with them *re* the proposed Dental Bill. Mr. E. Sheridan was appointed to confer with the Dental Association, and to report.

Medical Registration.—On the 11th December the Council appointed a Committee consisting of the President, Sir Robert Woods, and Sir Arthur Chance to wait on Mr. M'Gilligan, Minister for Commerce, *re* Medical Registration.

General Medical Council—Election of Representative.—On the 8th January Sir Arthur Chance was unanimously elected as representative on the General Medical Council.

Death of Mr. Henry Gregg Sherlock.—On the 8th January the Council passed a resolution of sympathy with Mrs. Sherlock on the death of her husband, Professor Henry Gregg Sherlock, F.R.C.S.I., who served so long as a Member of Council.

Charter Day Dinner.—The Charter Day Dinner was held on 14th March.

Local Government Board.—The following is an extract from a letter received, dated 27th March :—

“As you are aware, the Medical Act, 1925, which came into operation on the 21st February last, prolongs for a period of twelve months the arrangements that existed prior to the establishment of Saorstát Éireann for the control of the medical profession.

“The Minister for Local Government and Public Health wishes to confer with the representatives

of the licensing bodies to further consider the general position, and to elicit their views on the future control of the medical profession in the Saorstát. Would you be so good as to notify the representatives of the Royal College of Surgeons that the Minister has fixed Tuesday, 7th April, at 11 o'clock for the Conference, and that he hopes they will be able to attend at Room 227 in the Offices of this Department in Upper Merrion Street? Invitations to participate in the Conference are also being sent to delegates of the Irish Medical Committee and to the President and Vice-President of the Irish Medical Association.'

A deputation from the Council waited on the Minister, and the Fellows of the College may rest assured that the Government is fully alive to the desire of the medical profession.

Association of Surgeons.—The Council gave permission to the Association of Surgeons of Great Britain and Ireland to hold their meeting in the Examination Hall of the College under the Presidency of Sir William Taylor.

The Report indicates a fall in the figures as compared with previous years. This is to be explained partly by the reduction in the number of students attending for lectures and examinations and partly by the steadily diminishing supply of fresh material. A new regulation of the Governing Body of the Meath Hospital—the only steady source of supply for the past twenty years—has effectually choked the stream and seriously menaced the opportunities available to our students for attending autopsies or studying fresh specimens.


