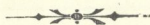

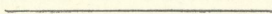

## ANNUAL REPORT.

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*Election of Honorary Librarian.*—On the 11th June Mr. A. A. Mc'Connell was unanimously re-elected as Honorary Librarian.

*Election of Examiners.*—On the 18th June the President and Council elected the Examiners for the ensuing year.

*Resignation of Dr. A. K. Henry.*—On 9th July Dr. A. K. Henry, Assistant to the Professor of Anatomy, resigned his position on his appointment to the Chair of Surgery in the University of Cairo. The Council, while regretting his resignation, tendered to Dr. Henry their congratulations on his appointment.

*Resignation of Mr. J. B. Story.*—On the 9th July Mr. J. B. Story resigned his position on the Council. His resignation was accepted with deep regret.

*Death of Mr. A. J. Blayney.*—On the 13th July the Council passed a resolution sympathising with the relatives of Mr. A. J. Blayney in the loss they had sustained.

A Special Meeting of the Council was held on 21st August to consider the present position of the Medical Profession, in view of the recent pronouncement of the Government on the question of a new Medical Register. The Council, having heard Mr. Maunsell, the following resolution was unanimously adopted, and directed to be sent to the press:—

That the Council desires to express its high appreciation of the conduct of the President (Mr. R. C. B. Maunsell) in the recent controversy, and its confidence in his defence of the interests of this College.

During the year the question of the proposed Medical Register frequently came before the Council, and the

*Education Grants.*—The following letter was received :—

EDUCATION GRANTS OFFICE,

As the Scheme of Educational Grants to ex-Service Students, inaugurated in 1919, has now come to an end, I am directed by His Majesty's Secretary of State for the Dominions to express to you his appreciation of the ready co-operation of the Royal College of Surgeons in the administration of the scheme.

No less than 167 of your students were in receipt of these grants, and of this number 78 per cent. have successfully completed their courses and taken their places in the medical profession. *Lister Memorial Prize.*—Sir Arthur Chance was unanimously nominated to represent this College in connection with the award of the Lister Memorial Prize.

*Death of Professor Scott.*—It is with profound regret that the Council report the death of Professor John Alfred Scott. The following resolution was adopted :—

That we, the President, Vice-President, and Council of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, desire to place on record our sympathy with

Mrs. Scott and the members of her family in their bereavement. They feel that the College has suffered an irreparable loss, and it is difficult for the Members of Council to think of the College of Surgeons without the name of Professor Scott being associated with it. Professor Scott was at all times helpful to those seeking knowledge, and his loss will be felt by his many pupils, spread all over the world.

*Resignation of Professor E. H. Tweedy.*—The resignation of Professor Tweedy was received on the 11th March. The Council accepted his resignation with regret.

*Montgomery Lectureship.*—Dr. Charles B. Goulden was unanimously elected to deliver the Mary Louisa Prentice Montgomery Lecture.

*Resignation of Professor Purser.*—The resignation of Professor Purser was accepted by the Council on the 8th April. The following resolution was unanimously adopted in connection with it:—

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously resolved to accept Professor Purser's resignation with regret, and, at the same time, to thank him for the way he had conducted his lectures and the high standard he had set to his pupils. It was also decided to ask Professor Purser to be good enough to act as Examiner at the midsummer examinations.

*Resignation of Professor R. J. Rowlette.*—The Council accepted Professor Rowlette's resignation on the 8th April with regret, and offered him their congratulations on his appointment as King's Professor in the School of Physic, Dublin University.

*University of Edinburgh.*—The President (Mr. R. C. B. Maunsell) was unanimously elected as a delegate to represent this College at the Celebrations on the 10th and 11th June in connection with the Bi-Centenary of the Foundation of the Faculty of Medicine.



*Election of Professors.*—On the 13th May the following were elected as Professors :—

Medicine—Dr. G. E. Nesbitt.

Midwifery—Dr. A. H. Davidson.

Pharmacology—Dr. L. Abrahamson.

The President reported that he had attended a conference with the Ministers for Local Government, Education, and Industry and Commerce on May 26th, and had been given a draft of the proposed Medical Bill. A further conference would be held on June 9th to discuss suggested alterations. Mr. Maunsell stated that, taken as a whole, the Bill was satisfactory, and followed closely the suggestions drawn up by him in November, 1925, for the establishment of a Local Register in addition to the General Register.
