GENTLEMEN,

I beg to apply for the position of Professor of Midwifery now vacant in your College.

As a student in the School of Surgery I gained the following distinctions:—

- 1888 Anatomy** (practical). First place and medal.
- Anatomy** (written—Prof. Frazer). First place and medal, bracketed equal with another candidate.
- Anatomy** (written—Prof. Thornley Stoker). Second place.
- 1889 Anatomy** (written). First place, bracketed equal.
- Anatomy** (practical). First place, bracketed equal.
- Surgery**. First place and silver medal.
- Histology**. First place, bracketed equal.
- 1890 Anatomy** (practical). First place.
- Medicine**. First place, bracketed equal.

In 1891 I obtained the silver medal for Clinical Medicine at Sir Patrick Dun's Hospital, also second-class honours, and a second-class exhibition at the second medical examination of the Royal University, and I took the qualifications of Licentiate of the Royal Colleges of Physicians and Surgeons in Ireland and Licentiate in Midwifery, Rotunda Hospital.

In 1892 I obtained first-class honours and a first-class exhibition at the Third Medical Examination of the Royal University.

In 1893 I obtained the degrees of M.B., B.Ch., B.A.O. at the Royal University, with first-class honours and a first-class exhibition, and later on I obtained the Travelling Medical Scholarship of the Royal University.
