## REPORT

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12th June, 1947.—It was decided that the new Fellowship Regulations should come into force in the Summer examinations, 1948.

10th July, 1947.—The Council's Prize was awarded to D. G. Misstear.

9th October, 1947.—It was decided to hold the Charter Day Dinner on February 14th, 1948, if this date would suit Sir Alfred Webb-Johnson to receive the Honorary Fellowship of the College.

It was also decided to hold a post-graduate course in April and May, 1948, and to advertise it at an early date.

Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney was nominated to be a member of the Medical Registration Council for a further period of five years, and was appointed to be a member of the General Council of Medical Education and Registration for one year.

8th January, 1948.—A Report was received from the Inspectors from London University, in which they recommended the recognition of the College for the next five years.

12th February, 1948.—Mr. Stoney and Mr. Doolin were proposed for nomination to the Cultural and Educational Panel of the Senate.

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### LIBRARY REPORT, 1947-48.

During the year April, 1947, to April, 1948, the usual periodicals were taken, and in addition, the *Annals of the Royal College of Surgeons of England*.

The books have been added to by purchase and donation. The following donations were received:—

From Elizabeth Mason-Hohl, M.D., Secretary-Treasurer, and Chief of Staff, Cancer Prevention Society, Los Angeles, U.S.A.—Trotula of Salerno. *The diseases of women*. A translation of *Passionibus mulierum curandorum*, by Elizabeth Mason-Hohl (Ward Ritchie Press, U.S.A., 1947).

From Prof. Mahfouz Pasha, Emeritus Professor of Obstetrics and Gynæcology, Cairo—A copy of his book, *The history of medical education in Egypt* (Cairo, 1935).

From Prof. Samson Wright—Sir Charles Sherrington. *The integrative action of the nervous system* (Cambridge, 1947).

Books were also received from Mr. Arthur Chance, F.R.C.S.I., and Mr. William Doolin, F.R.C.S.I., Honorary Librarian.

The total number of books and periodicals borrowed during the year by Fellows, licentiates and students amounted to 9,130. Exhibitions of books, etc., organised during the year proved of the greatest interest to those who came to look at them, and all were impressed with the richness of historical material which the College has fortunately inherited in its Library. The exhibitions were as follows:—

*Obstetrics and Gynæcology.* A survey from ancient times to the end of the 19th century, organised at the request of the Committee of the Rotunda Bi-Centenary Congress of Obstetrics and Gynæcology. Most of the material came from the College Library, and items belonging to the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland, the Rotunda Hospital, and several private owners were displayed.

*Tuberculosis.*—A small collection of works illustrating important contributions to the knowledge of this disease from Hippocrates to Villemin.

*Charter Day.*—This exhibition included items relating to the foundation of the College in 1784, and a collection of works by Honorary Fellows from 1784 to 1921.

In response to a request from the Polish libraries for assistance in replacing war damage, 27 parcels of duplicate *Surgery, Gynæcology, and Obstetrics*, and *British Journal of Surgery* were sent to the Polish Embassy, London, for distribution.

The Librarian, Dr. J. D. H. Widdess, was appointed Recorder of the Medical Committee of the newly formed Irish Society for Documentation.

The Board of Governors of the Meath Hospital have deposited a number of minute books and other records in the Library for safe keeping.
