REPORT.

10th July, 1941.—Professor Chance was re-elected as Professor of Surgery. Professor Boxwell was re-elected as Professor of Pathology. Professor Davidson was re-elected as Professor of Midwifery and Gynæcology. Professor Bewley was re-elected as Professor of Preventive Medicine and Medical Jurisprudence.

9th October, 1941.—Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney was appointed to be a member of the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of the United Kingdom for the term of one year from the 14th day of October, 1941.

It was resolved to ask Group Captain P. C. Livingston, F.R.C.S., to deliver the Montgomery Lecture in 1942.

Library.

GENTLEMEN,

During the past year extensive changes have been effected.

A Report on the general condition of the Library, with details of a scheme for the re-arrangement of the Books and Journals, and a revision of the Catalogue, was prepared by the Assistant Librarian and submitted to the Council.

The scheme was approved, and the work was begun during the Summer Vacation. All the volumes in the Library, numbering approximately 40,000, were taken from the shelves, and disposed of as follows:—

Works of particular interest or rarity, which were dispersed among the general collection, have been given a special place, where their safe keeping will be assured. This section consists of some 1,300 volumes, among which are included first editions of Medical and Surgical classics, specimens of early printing, and books illustrated with choice wood-cuts or engravings. Many of their bindings were found to need cleaning or repairs, essential to the preservation of the books, and this work is now being done. It is estimated that the purchase of these works, at prevailing values, would call for an outlay of at least £4,000. Some

were exhibited at the last Inaugural Meeting of the Biological Society, and created considerable interest.

By the transfer of a number of books to the Museum cases which formerly housed Zoological specimens, much needed space has been gained, and the undesirable practice of doubling or trebling the rows of books rendered unnecessary. All books removed to the Museum will be catalogued, and can be located if required.

Out-of-date students' text-books, and a number of works unrelated to medicine, and of no permanent scientific interest, have been removed from the Library, whereby additional space has been provided. The Council has permitted the sale of these volumes, the proceeds to be used for renovating or repairing the bindings of rare books, referred to above.

Books kept in the main Library have been re-classified, and arranged in sections according to subjects, following the Dewey system, now widely adopted.

The Journals have also been re-arranged. As more space is now available, they can be kept in proper sequence, which greatly facilitates location.

The existing manuscript Author Catalogue has been revised, and is now being transferred to index cards. When this has been completed, a Subject Catalogue will be prepared. The latter will be a new addition to the Library.

The work detailed above was made possible by means of a grant provided by the Council, whom the Assistant Librarian wishes to thank for the interest they have taken in the initiation and carrying out of the scheme. He would also acknowledge the advice and support given him by the Hon. Librarian, which have been most helpful, and the co-operation of Professor Boxwell, who has permitted the accommodation of books in part of the Museum.

Since the beginning of the Academic Year in October last, 1,901 Books and Periodicals have been issued to readers, who included Fellows, Licentiates, and Students of the College, and other members of the profession.

The usual Journals, University and College Calendars, and other Periodicals have been received. At the suggestion of the Radiological Society of Ireland, the following additional Journals will be taken:—"Radiology," and "The American Journal of Roentgenology and Radium Therapy."

Books have been acquired by purchase and donation. A list of recent additions may be seen in the Library.

Donations received include the sum of £10 10s. from the

Students' Union Committee for the purchase of text-books. A Doctor's Diploma in Medicine and Philosophy of the University of Padua, dated 1625, has been presented by Dr. H. Michael.

Museum.

GENTLEMEN,

I beg to submit as hereunder the Annual Report on the Museum Collection of Pathological specimens.

Considerable use has been made of it during the year for teaching, demonstration, and examination purposes, although the number of new specimens added has been on a somewhat reduced scale, owing to the impossibility of obtaining adequate supplies of preservatives such as formalin, alcohol, and glycerine. This deficiency has, however, been made good in part through the work of Dr. Pollock, who has made further search through the specimens from the old Museum collection. He has made some valuable finds, particularly in the Cardio-vascular series, and these are now in process of being labelled, catalogued, and put in place.

Specimens borrowed from the Collection by examiners:—
In Medicine, 6; in Surgery, 34; in Midwifery, 5; in Pathology, about 90.

New Specimens added:—By Dr. O'Donnell, Mercer's Hospital, 1; by The Curator from the Meath Hospital, 6. Specimens remounted in colour, 12.

Specimens used in illustration of regular lectures and in the course of Term revision classes ran into hundreds.

Considering the difficulties encountered during the year from the prolonged hold up of CO₂ Gas Cylinders and the shortage of coal gas, the work of the Department has been maintained at a satisfactory level.


