The College.

The War.

The "Roll of Honour," containing the names of Fellows and Licentiates who have given or are giving their services to the State, now contains nearly 1,500 names.

During the past year, under the organization of the President of the College, a Military General Hospital in France was successfully staffed by men educated in the Dublin Schools of Medicine.

Honorary Fellowship of the College.

On March 21st, 1918, it was unanimously decided to confer the Honorary Fellowship of the College on Major Harvey Cushing, of the United States Medical Service. The Ceremony took place on May 25th, and Field-Marshal His Excellency Viscount French graced the proceedings with his presence.

Grant from His Majesty's Treasury.

The Council report with pleasure that the claims of the College for a Grant from His Majesty's Treasury having been pressed upon the Government, a special Grant of £2,000 has been received.

A cordial vote of thanks was passed by the Council to the President for his successful efforts, and also to Mr. Miller, Registrar of the College, for his valuable assistance, in obtaining the Grant.

Election of Honorary Librarian.

Mr. R. Bolton M'Causland was re-elected Honorary Librarian.

Election of Secretary of Council.

On June 7th, 1917, Mr. Charles M. Benson was re-elected Secretary of Council.

Resignation of Professor T. Gillman Moorhead, M.D.

On 21st June, 1917, Professor Moorhead resigned the Chair of Medicine.

Election of Professor of the Theory and Practice of Physic.

On 26th July, 1917, the Council assembled for the purpose of appointing a Professor of the Theory and Practice of Medicine in the room of Professor T. Gillman Moorhead, resigned, when Francis Carmichael Purser, M.D., F.R.C.P.I., was unanimously elected.

Death of Professor Frederic William Kidd.

The Council heard with much regret of the death on September 6th, 1917, of Professor F. W. Kidd, who for nineteen years was Professor of Midwifery and Gynæcology in the Schools of Surgery. The following resolution was adopted:—

“That at this their first meeting, the President, Vice-President, and members of the Council of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, desire to place on record their regret at the death, on 6th September, of Professor Frederic William Kidd who for nineteen years was Professor of Midwifery and Gynæcology in the Schools of Surgery, and they further desire to tender to Mrs. Kidd and the members of his family an expression of sympathy in their bereavement.”

Election of Professor of Midwifery and Gynæcology.

On the 15th October, 1917, the Council assembled for the purpose of electing a Professor of Midwifery and Gynæcology, when E. Hastings Tweedy, F.R.C.P.I., was unanimously elected, *vice* Professor Kidd, deceased.

Election of Professor of Pathology.

On 17th January, 1918, the Council unanimously elected William Boxwell, M.D., F.R.C.P.I., to the Chair of Pathology, *vice* Professor A. H. White, deceased.

Representative of the College on the General Medical Council.

On February 7th, 1918, Sir Arthur Chance was re-elected to represent the College on the General Medical Council.

Barker Anatomical Prize, 1917.

In the competition for the Barker Anatomical Prize for 1917, the adjudicators awarded the prize to Mr. M. Barden; and a special prize to Mr. T. P. Garry; both students in the College School.

Carmichael Prize Essay Competition, 1917.

In the competition for this prize there were two competitors, and on the recommendation of the adjudicators a prize of £100 was awarded to Captain J. C. M'Walter, R.A.M.C., Dublin, for his essay, signed “Socrates.”

Votes of Condolence.

On the 4th of October, 1917, a vote of condolence was passed with the family of the late Professor F. W. Kidd.

On 6th December, 1917, a vote of condolence was passed on the loss incurred by Mr. H. Gregg Sherlock, by the death of his eldest son, Captain Charles Sherlock, R.A.M.C., on active service in Mesopotamia.

On 6th December, 1917, a vote of condolence was passed with Mr. Edward H. Taylor, on the loss of his brother, Captain George Taylor, R.A.M.C., on active service in Mesopotamia.

On March 7th, 1918, a vote of condolence was passed with Mrs. Redmond, on the death of Mr. John Redmond, M.P., and the Council adjourned as a mark of respect to his memory.

On May 2nd, 1918, a vote of condolence was passed with the family of the late Mr. H. Macnaughton-Jones, F.R.C.S.I., formerly Professor of Obstetrics and Gynæcology at Queen's College, Cork, who had presented valuable gifts to the museum, and generously endowed a Gold Medal in Midwifery and Gynæcology in the Schools of Surgery.

On May 2nd a vote of condolence was passed with Professor Auchinleck, F.R.C.S.I., on the death of his wife.

Meetings held in the College.

The Council granted the use of the College for meetings of the Royal Academy of Medicine in Ireland, the Irish Medical Association, Royal Medical Benevolent Fund Society, Irish Medical Committee, Dublin Clinical Club, and the Irish Branch of the British Dental Association.

Charter-Day Dinner.

Owing to the war, it was decided not to hold the usual Charter-Day Dinner.

Honorarium to Mr. Alfred Miller, Registrar of the College.

On October 4th, 1917, the Council granted to the Registrar of the College an Honorarium of £100, in recognition of special services rendered in connexion with the preparation of statement of claim on the Government, for damage done to the College property during the rebellion of 1916.

The Officers' Training Corps.

The Officers' Training Corps is being maintained in its usual efficiency, and has acted as a guard of honour to Field-Marshal His Excellency Viscount French, K.P.

Library.

Report of the Librarian.

GENTLEMEN,

The Museum.

Curator's Report.

GENTLEMEN,

Extensive use of the specimens in the Pathological Collection has again been made, though not in the same degree as last year, and comparatively few new specimens have been procured. Only three have been mounted permanently, as suitable mounting fluid is now unobtainable. Of the new specimens added to the collection, two were given by the President, two by Steevens's Hospital, two by Dr. Harvey, one by Dr. Crofton, and seven by the Curator. For some reason a difficulty has been universally felt this year in obtaining fresh pathological material.


