REPORT

8th June, 1944.—Dr. D. O'Donoghue was invited to give the Montgomery Lecture for 1945.

13th July, 1944.—A sub-committee of the Finance Committee was empowered to spend up to £300 on alterations in the Physiology Lecture Theatre in order to accommodate a larger number of students.

12th October, 1944.—The Council approved the suggestion that the memorial to the late Professor William Boxwell take the form of improvements in the Pathology department of the Schools which will enable one part of the laboratories to be set aside as "The William Boxwell Bacteriological Laboratory".

Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney was appointed to be a member of the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of the United Kingdom for a period of one year, and was also nominated to be a member of the Lister Memorial Fund Committee.

9th November, 1944.—The Council approved proposals for the institution of a class in practical clinical Physiology and for obtaining estimates for making the necessary alterations.

14th December, 1944.—The Council made a donation of One Hundred Guineas to the fund for the restoration and development of the Royal College of Surgeons of England.

7th February, 1945.—Dr. David Michael Mitchell was elected Professor of Pharmacology.

Dr. L. Abrahamson was re-elected Professor of Medicine and Dr. J. D. H. Widdess was re-elected Lecturer in Biology.

13th April, 1945.—The Royal College of Surgeons of England informed the Council that Fellows and Licentiates of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland will now be accepted for the examinations of the English College whether or no they also hold a University degree.

Mr. Wm. Doolin and Mr. F. Gill were chosen to represent the College at a Conference on the Co-ordination of Fellowship regulations to be held in London on Thursday, May 3rd, 1945.

LIBRARY.

GENTLEMEN,

During the last year 5,777 books and periodicals were borrowed, an increase of 1,740 over the previous year's total.

The usual Journals were received. Books were added by donation and purchase, and a rare work by Robert Hooke, the "Micrographia", published in 1665, was acquired by exchange of duplicates. This classic of 17th-century microscopy is a welcome addition to our collection of works dealing with this subject. Samuel Pepys wrote concerning this book: "Before I went to bed I sat up till two o'clock in my chamber reading of Mr. Hooke's Microscopicall Observations, the most ingenious book that ever I read in my life".

The following donations were received:—

Dr. T. P. C. Kirkpatrick—"The Clinical Club. 1894-1944", and "Steevens' Hospital, Dublin", both written by him.

A Bequest of approximately 2,000 books, and a large bookcase, was made by the late Sir William Wheeler, President R.C.S.I. in 1922-23. The bookcase and many of the books belonged originally to Richard Butcher, President R.C.S.I. 1866-67, the inventor of Butcher's saw, of whom it was written:—

Some follow letters, others follow law,
And some find happiness in War's alarm;
But he upholds the glory of the saw
And wields his weapon with titanic arm.

Butcher's library and bookcase were left by him to his pupil, William Wheeler (Sir William's father), who was President R.C.S.I., ~~1866-67~~. Among the interesting documents in this collection are Butcher's case notes and other personal records, referred to by Sir William in Surgery, Gynaecology, and Obstetrics, 1933, Vol. LVI, pp. 257-279. Another volume of notes and drawings has been identified as the work of John Houston, Curator of the College Museum, 1824-1843. He was the first in Dublin to apply the microscope in pathology, and these drawings of cancer cells, in which connection Houston was following the work of Müller, are undoubtedly the first of their kind in Ireland. The collection is now known as the Wheeler-Butcher Library, and it is the largest benefaction received by the Library since Arthur Jacob gave his books as a gift in 1871.

The above donations and bequest are very much appreciated, and it is hoped that our Library will continue to benefit in this way. Owners of books, manuscripts, and other material of interest in connection with the history of medicine and surgery, who wish to ensure the permanent preservation and care of them, may be assured that their object would be well attained should they decide to place them in our collection.

Further progress has been made in the binding and repairing of rare books.

Exhibitions of works important in the history of mid-wifery and embryology, and original documents, etc., relating to the development of the Schools of Surgery, were arranged during the past year.

A series of three lectures on the history of the College Schools was given by the Assistant Librarian.

MUSEUM.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to submit the following report on the Museum for the year 1945.

Specimens were placed at the disposal of Examiners in other subjects as in previous years.

Difficulties are, if anything, greater in regard to preserving solutions, mountings, jars and other requirements, so that only specimens of exceptional nature can be added to the Museum.

Among such were:—

- (1) Carcinoma of clitoris.
- (2) Typhoid ulceration of gall bladder.
- (3) Gastric ulcer.

Some twenty specimens already mounted have been added on loan from St. Laurence Hospital (Richmond).

During last year a number of gross unmounted specimens were exhibited and were available to illustrate lectures.

A number of specimens of exceptional interest which were found more or less discarded were cleaned, remounted and put back into the Museum. They include the series of monsters—many of these specimens of great rarity.
