REPORT

9th May.—Mr. C. P. Smyly presented the College with some 300 books and a large number of old Surgical instruments. Among the books are several volumes in manuscript, including John Hunter's lectures in the hand of Sir Philip Crampton, and case notes taken at the Meath Hospital. Instruments for ear, nose and throat work, lithotrites and some early anæsthetic apparatus are of particular interest. The Council gratefully accepted the gift.

13th June.—Donations for the Library were received from Mr. C. Somerville-Large, F.R.C.S.I., books and anatomical plates; Ralph Cusack, Esq., a plaster medallion head of James William Cusack former President of the College; and W. G. R. Jacob, Esq., the silver medal given to John the brother of Arthur Jacob.

12th July.—Lady Holland presented a portrait of Surgeon Butcher done on porcelain, Professor G. Grey Turner a copy of his book and Mr. Wm. Doolin, F.R.C.S.I. four commemorative medals

14th November.—Mr. Wm. Doolin, F.R.C.S.I. proposed that a post-graduate course in Surgery be organised by the College with the co-operation of the Hospitals.

12th December.—Professor Evatt resigned from his post as Professor of Anatomy. His resignation was accepted with regret and he was thanked for his long service of thirty years to the College.

9th January.—The Honorary Fellowship of the College was awarded to Sir Alfred Webb Johnson, Bart., K.C.V.O., O.B.E., D.S.O., President of the Royal College of Surgeons in England.

LIBRARY.

GENTLEMEN,

The usual periodicals were received during the year, and books were added by purchase and donation.

Two new periodicals have been added, *Abstracts of World Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynæcology* and *The American Practitioner*, the latter being substituted for *Clinics*, publication of which has ceased.

The following donations were received:—

The Hon. Librarian—Four medals commemorative of Laennec, Villemin, Edward Halloran Bennett and Victor Pauchet. Also two works on the history of anæsthesia.

M. J. MacManus, Esq.—*Phthisologia: or a treatise of consumption*. Richard Morton. London, 1694. (The first edition of an important work in the history of tuberculosis).

J. Boyd, Esq., B.A.—26 volumes of the *Journal of the Chemical Society*.

The total number of borrowings by Fellows, Licentiates and students of the College for the past year is 9,110, a considerable increase over previous years.

A considerable amount of cataloguing and arranging of books has been carried out. Included in this work is the completion of cataloguing books removed to the basement store-room, of Mr. Smyly's large donation of books, and of the collection of pamphlets. Of the latter, 3,700 have been dealt with, most of which are publications dating from the XVIth to the XIXth centuries, many of which are now of considerable value and rarity.

An exhibition of books, instruments and pictures in connection with the centenary of anæsthesia was held in the Ante-room from October to December, 1946. A total of some 100 items was shown, and the exhibition, which aroused considerable interest, was largely attended by medical men and students and many of the general public. Events and discoveries from earliest times leading up to the introduction of general and local anæsthesia were illustrated.

A smaller exhibition of books and microscopes dealing with the early history of microscopy was also displayed in the library.

At the request of the Committee of the forthcoming Congress of Obstetrics and Gynæcology next July, the preparation of an Exhibition related to these subjects is at present in progress.
