## ANNUAL REPORT

*May, 1958*—Examiners were elected for College Examinations and those of the Conjoint Board.

Reciprocity in the Primary Fellowship examination has been granted to the South African College of Physicians and Surgeons.

The Royal College of Physicians reported that under Bye-Law 122 of the English College our Licentiates could be admitted to the Membership Examination of that body on the recommendation of the Censors.

The Collegium Oto-Rhino-Laryngologicum Amicitæ Sacrum was allowed the use of the College for their banquet in August.

Dr. M. L. Abrahamson was appointed for one year as assistant to the Professor of Medicine.

*June, 1958*—Committees were elected. It was decided to confer the Honorary Fellowship upon Professor Eelco Huizinga of Groningen, Sir Victor Negus of King's College Hospital and on Professor Georges Portmann, Dean of the Medical School of Bordeaux.

Professor Mercer is to give the next Abraham Colles lecture.

The new President made a presentation on behalf of his colleagues of a silver tray to the retiring President, Mr. A. B. Clery.

*July, 1958*—Mr. Doolin reported the circumstances under which Mrs. McCready had given to him for presentation to the Library the letter in which Abraham Colles resigns from his Lectureship in Anatomy and Physiology and applies for the Professorship of the Theory and Practice of Surgery.

Dr. Bert Seligmann, M.D., of the Flower Hospital gave the College one hundred dollars in appreciation of the services given to him by our Licentiates.

The College also received a gift of one thousand pounds from Messrs Ethicon Limited for redecorating the Hall and the Board Room.

It was decided to appoint Clinical tutors in Jervis Street and Mercers Hospitals.

*October, 1958*—Professor D. Mitchell was appointed to represent the College on the Medical Research Council for five years from 26th January, 1959.

It was decided to award the Honorary Fellowship to Sir Archibald McIndoe and Sir Walter Mercer.

The Primary Fellowship Examination from 1960 onwards will be in three parts, Anatomy, Pathology and Bacteriology.

In connection with the proposal for the institution of a Faculty of Anæsthetists, Counsel informed Council that under the present Charter and Bye-Laws they have full powers so to do.

Messrs. Glaxo have agreed to give a sum of five hundred pounds a year for five years for a research Fellowship in Anatomy. The first holder is to be Mr. Pisko-Dubienski.

*November, 1958*—Members of Council agreed to present candelabra to the College for use at the Charter Day Dinner.

It was decided to institute an Abraham Colles Museum in the room used by the Association (which will still have the use of the room) and Mr. T. G. Wilson was appointed Honorary Curator.

Sir Walter Mercer presented the College with a silver Quaich.

The Council decided to found four Research Fellowships each to be worth six hundred pounds a year; the subjects to be in Physiology, Pharmacology, Pathology and Bacteriology and the Fellowships to be named after famous men.

Mr. T. C. J. O'Connell was invited to give a post-graduate lecture in January and Mr. Vaughan Hudson to give an



Abraham Colles lecture in February. It was decided to have a small dinner in College before each public lecture.

*December, 1958*—The Council suffered the loss of its senior member Mr. J. F. L. Keegan.

The Honorary Fellowship is to be given to Sir Ernest Finch.

Satisfaction was expressed to those responsible for the most efficient way in which the cardiac arrest demonstration had been carried out.

*January, 1959*—Dr. R. B. Dockrell was appointed representative on the General Dental Council for five years from July 4th, 1959.

Dr. O'Daly was appointed Arthur Jacob Research Fellow in Physiology.

*February, 1959*—Sir Archibald McIndoe presented the College with an antique snuff box and Sir Ernest Finch gave them a silver dish.

Dr. Michael Joyce was appointed John Houston Research Fellow in Pathology to work on the use of living spirochaetes notably in the treponema immobilisation test and on the possibility of the use of these organisms in complement fixation agglutination and in other reactions.

Dr. P. A. Browne was also appointed to a Research Fellowship to work under Professor O'Connor in conjunction with Mr. D. J. Riordan and Mr. T. C. J. O'Connell on the use of radio isotopes in the diagnosis of malignancy. Since there will be some considerable expense on equipment in this case the fourth fellowship will not be filled this year.

Professor Welbourne was invited to give a post graduate lecture in May.

The Government has agreed to subscribe £80,000 towards building a new Dental Hospital and a suitable site has been found. The Council agreed to the new articles of agreement which are necessary.

Sir Archibald McIndoe has been invited to give an Abraham Colles lecture in the Autumn.

At the Charter Day Dinner Mr. R. Atkinson Stoney was presented with his portrait painted by Mr. David Hone. The same painter has executed a copy of the painting of Abraham Colles which is in Dr. Steevens Hospital.

## REPORT OF THE LIBRARY

**For the year ending 5th April, 1959**

Fellows, Licentiates, and students borrowed a total of 12,008 books and periodicals during the past year. The usual periodicals were received, and books were acquired by purchase and donation.

A large proportion of the work done in the Library cannot be expressed quantitatively, *i.e.*, advice and assistance to readers and search for bibliographical references on behalf of authors. The latter service is usually, though not invariably, acknowledged in their publications.

The Librarian was asked to read the proofs of the third edition of *Notable Names in Medicine and Surgery*, by Hamilton Bailey and W. J. Bishop, published by Lewis, which is to appear shortly.

Books were donated by the following:—

Dr. James Shaw, Belfast, presented instruments which he invented:—

1. A modified stethoscope.
2. The prototype of a portable device for turning on an ordinary water tap without handling, as required in aseptic surgery. This was patented by Messrs. Downes Bros.
3. An instrument for aspirating material from a tonsillar crypt.
4. An appliance for facilitating the physiotherapist in the application of faradic stimulation.

The Library premises has been extended by the addition of a basement room, which was renovated, shelved, ventilated, and connected with the main reading room by a stair-case.

**ANNUAL REPORT ON THE MUSEUM, 1958-59**

Owing to the increase in the number of specimens received, a series of new sections were opened in the Museum and a descriptive catalogue of the Museum was begun during the academic year using a Cardex File system mounted on the outside of each section of the Museum.

The cards in this system, give clinical and histological details of each section, and about two-thirds of the work has been done. Miss R. Smith was employed during the year for the typing of cards and cataloguing.

The installation of strip lighting in the Museum has made a very big difference.
