

The College.

The War.

The Council decided to inscribe on a "Roll of Honour" the names of Fellows and Licentiates who have given or are giving their services to the State. The first edition, containing over 1000 names, is in the hands of the printers, and will be published as soon as possible.

*History of the College.**

Through the energy of the author, Sir Charles A. Cameron, C.B., a second edition of *The History of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland* has just been published. The History has been revised, and considerable additions made to bring it up to date.

Election of Honorary Librarian.

Mr. R. Bolton M'Causland was re-elected Honorary Librarian.

Election of Secretary of Council.

On June 10th, 1915, Mr. Charles M. Benson was re-elected Secretary of Council.

Resignation of Professor Arthur H. White.

On July 1st, 1915, Professor Arthur White resigned, on account of ill-health, the Chair of Pathology, and on the 15th September the Council assembled for the purpose of appointing a Professor of Pathology; it was decided to postpone the election until June, 1916, or the end of the war.

Election of Professor of Chemistry and of Physics.

On the 16th September, 1915, the Council assembled for the purpose of appointing a Professor of Chemistry and of Physics, in the room of Professor Edwin Lapper, resigned, when Mr. William Caldwell was duly elected.

Barker Anatomical Prize for 1915.

This prize was awarded to Mr. W. E. Lubbe, a pupil in the College School; and a special prize to Mr. J. F. Seale.

New By-Law, No. 18.

At the Meeting of the Council, held on July 22nd, 1915, the following new By-Law was adopted :—

No Fellow or Licentiate shall commit, do, or suffer any act or thing which shall result in his or her being convicted, either in His Majesty's Dominions or elsewhere, of an offence which, if committed in Ireland, would be a felony or misdemeanour; or commit, do, or suffer any act or thing which shall result in his or her name being erased from the Medical Register by the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of the United Kingdom; or be guilty of any infamous conduct in any professional respect, or be guilty of a breach of the declaration taken by him or her for the purpose of obtaining his or her Diploma or Letters Testimonial; or commit, do, or suffer any act or thing which the Council shall by resolution have declared to be inconsistent with or prejudicial to the reputation, honour, or dignity of the College.

The By-Law was approved of by the Lord Lieutenant on the 23rd November, 1915.

Representative of the College on the General Medical Council.

On February 3rd, 1916, Sir Arthur Chance was re-elected to represent the College on the General Medical Council.

Meetings held in the College.

The Council granted the use of the College for meetings of the Royal Academy of Medicine in Ireland, the Irish Medical Association, Royal Medical Benevolent Fund Society, Irish Medical Committee, Dublin Clinical Club, and the Irish Branch British Dental Association.

Charter-Day Dinner.

Owing to the War, it was decided not to hold the usual Charter-Day Dinner.

Votes of Condolence.

On the 16th September, 1915, a resolution of condolence was passed on hearing of the loss incurred by Sir Charles A. Cameron, by the death of his son, Lieutenant Cameron, Royal Dublin Fusiliers.

On the 2nd December, 1915, a vote of condolence was passed on hearing of the death of Mr. Francis T. Heuston, who had acted for many years as Professor of Anatomy and as a member of Council.

On 2nd December, 1915, a vote of condolence was passed on hearing of the death of Dr. Arthur Hamilton White, until recently Professor of Pathology in the College School.

On the 15th April, 1916, a vote of condolence was passed on hearing of the death of Sir Charles Bent Ball, Bart., a Member of the Council.

Vote of Congratulation.

On the 18th May the congratulations of the Council were conveyed to Mr. Edward H. Taylor, a Member of the Council, on his appointment to the post of Regius Professor of Surgery, Dublin University.

Gift to the College.

The College has been presented with a large framed photograph of the late Mr. R. J. Montgomery, F.R.C.S.I., founder of "The Montgomery Lectureship in Ophthalmology." The thanks of the Council were conveyed to the donors, the Misses Montgomery.

The Rebellion.

On Easter Monday, April 24th, 1916, the College Buildings were forcibly occupied by a contingent of Sinn Feiners, under the command of the Countess Markievicz. Owing to the Bank Holiday and the Easter vacations, there was no one in the College except two porters and their families. The rebels remained in occupation until Sunday, April 30th, when they unconditionally surrendered to the military forces of the Crown.

Considerable damage was done to the interior of the College, for which compensation will be applied for.

From the date of the surrender until Saturday, May 27th, the College Buildings were occupied by four hundred soldiers of the 5th Lincolnshire Regiment, and some twelve officers, under the command of Colonel Walker.

The Conjoint Examining Board.

The representation of the two Colleges on the Conjoint Examining Board was considered before a Committee of representatives of the two Colleges. A report, the result of their deliberations, was approved by both Colleges.

The Officers' Training Corps.

The efficiency of the Officers' Training Corps has been maintained during the year, and the new band has proved a great help in the route marches, and in connexion with recruiting.

During the Easter vacation the members of the O.T.C. were not in the College to resist the occupation of the College buildings by the rebels, but a considerable number of them reported to the nearest military authorities, and were actively engaged in helping them.

Library.

Report of the Librarian.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to submit my Annual Report, and beg leave to state that the Library has been made use of by a large number of Students, Licentiates, Fellows, and members of His Majesty's Royal Army Medical Corps.

Since my last Report the following Journals have been presented by the Editors:—British Dental Journal, Canada; Canadian Medical Association Journal, Post-Graduate Course Journal, West London Medical Journal, Journal of the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, Proceedings and Transactions of the Royal Dublin Society, Proceedings and Transactions of the Royal Society of London, Journal of Royal Navy Medical Service.

The following were presented by the Royal Academy of Medicine, per J. Alfred Scott, F.R.C.S.I., Secretary:—Medical Magazine, Medical Review, Bristol Medico-Chirurgical Journal, Birmingham Medical Review, Australasian Medical Gazette, Proceedings of the Royal Society of Medicine, Transactions of the American Surgical Association, Transactions of the Royal Academy of Medicine in Ireland.

The Calendars of the various licensing bodies and Universities have been received, and the College Calendar was sent in return; and about seventy volumes were bound.

The following books were presented:—Collected Papers, 1913-14, by the Lister Institution of Preventive Medicine; Thomas Quinlan, L.D.S., On the Science of the Dental Elevator, presented by the Author; eleven volumes of the Medical Annual, by S. H. Law, F.R.C.S.I.; Radium, X-Rays, and the Living Cell (Colwell and Russ), by Messrs. Bell & Co.; also a large number of Public Health Reports, by Sir Charles Cameron.

The following books have been added to the Library:—Elementary Biology, by Parker; Manual of Chemistry, by Luff and Candy; Text-book of Science, by W. A. Miller; Lessons in Organic Chemistry, by G. S. Turpin; Introduction to Modern Inorganic Chemistry, by J. W. Mellor; British Journal of Surgery; Physiological Tracts; Studdert's Treatment of Fractures (Eighth Edition); Mayo Clinics; Murphy Clinics; International Clinics; Churchill's Medical Directory; Thom's Directory; Murray's English Dictionary; Whittaker's Almanack; Bradshaw.

On the 24th of April the rebels took possession of the College. A large number of the books out of the Library were taken to form barricades in the Entrance Hall. It has not yet been possible to ascertain what books have been taken, and what permanent damage has been done in this Department.


